Emerging	Unable to explain the benefits of learning though play and/or describe how leaning through play can be supported from infancy though mid-elementary levels.

CLO 2:	Students will be able to develop grammatically correct, specific and clear lesson plans that demonstrate learning through play with goals and objectives. Lesson plans include materials, activities and assessment methods.
Outstanding	Develops grammatically correct, specific and clear lesson plans with appropriate goals and objectives, materials, activities, and assessment methods without assistance. All parts of the lesson plan are appropriate and correct.
Proficient	Develops grammatically correct, specific and clear lesson plans with appropriate goals and objectives, materials, activities, and assessment methods minimal assistance. All or most parts of the lesson plan are appropriate and correct.
Developing	Develops grammatically correct, specific and clear lesson plans with appropriate goals and objectives, materials, activities, and assessment methods with regular assistance. Numerous parts of the lesson plan are not appropriate or correct unless constant assistance is given.
Emerging	Unable to develop grammatically correct, specific and clear lesson plans with appropriate goals and objectives, materials, activities, and assessment methods even with assistance. Most parts of the lesson plan are inappropriate and incorrect.
