Grand Cordon of the Order of the Rising Sun is considered first class which was established in 1875 as Japan's first order. Awarded in nine classes prior to 2003.

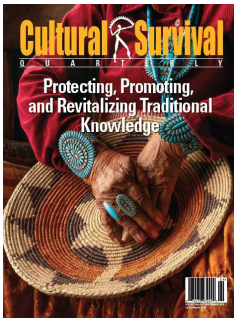
