PCC NIFA Grant Project

Palau Community College recently completed the first year of a competitive grant awarded from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)-National Institute of Agriculture (NIFA) in the amount of \$149,500 to build faculty capacity and enhance instructional delivery of student learning outcomes through distance education for Agriculture and related sciences programs. The main objectives of this two-year project are to strengthen and improve curricula, enhance quality and effectiveness of instructional delivery methods, enable faculty to integrate use of technology and adopt effective and engaging alternative instructional modes through distance education for the agricultural and related science programs at the College. Although the main targets of the project are the students and faculty of Agriculture and related science programs at the College, the outcomes and benefits have had positive impacts on other programs at the College. Activities successfully completed during the first year of the project were modifications of curricula for the Agriculture and related science programs, upgrade of the PCC online server and the PCC Online lab, professional development for faculty, and faculty cross-trainings in the Moodle learning management system. Modifications of curricula were essential to make sure those programs and student learning outcomes are consistent with the ever changing science knowledge

and technology so graduates are better prepared for the workforce or transfer to four-year colleges and universities. The upgrading of the online server was necessary groundwork that now enables the College to provide more learning opportunities and become accessible through distance education. Additionally, it allows faculty to diversify and enhance their teaching methods, and integrate more interactive technology into delivery of student learning outcomes. Through this NIFA project, five faculty attended the Moodle Moot USA in September. These five faculty recently conducted a hands-on workshop and shared with other faculty the new features of Moodle LMS and how to use them to enhance student learning. This NIFA project is directed by Sherry Ngirmeriil, an associate professor in the environmental/marine science program, and co-directed by Fredrick Ikertang, an associate professor in the Agriculture science programs.


