**SDSU Begins SPED 500 course** 



On December 19, 2019 San Diego State University bachelor's cohort begin the course on special education. The course provides a multidisciplinary approach to the historical, philosophical, and legal aspects of special education.

This course meets special education mainstream requirement for all basic teaching credentials, addresses the characteristics and understanding of persons with disabilities, person who are deaf, youth as at risk, and persons who are labeled gifted and talented.

The course will approach disabilities from different discipline such as sociology, anthropology, health, political science, linguistics, education, and communication.

Course instructor is Dr. Christopher R. Brum, Assistant Professor of SDSU Colleg e of Education. Dr. Brum has co-author two publications titled "Assessment of students with visual impairments and additional disabilities" and "Communication programming for individuals with genetic causes of severe disability and visual impairment".


