

Basic Conversational Palauan Course Commence

On Tuesday, February 4, 2020 Palau Community College Continuing Education launched Basic Conversational Palauan language course at PCC Continuing Education training room. Over ten community members from various private businesses and foreign offices participated in this two-week fundamental language class. This class is an 18 hrs course module that introduce students to basic pronounciation with most frequently used words and simple introductory, greetings, directional words and phrases. Students will also learn useful vocabulary used in everday conversation. Class participation include group discussion and individual presentation. Course content includes introductory conversation, greetings in both conversation and words, sentences for simple direction, and vocabulary and phrases in everday communication. Course instructor is Mr. Kaipo Rechiungel. Students completing the course will be able to recognize and pronounce daily conversational words, capable of sending greetings, introductory words to native speakers, and apply basic Palauan words and phrases in daily conversation with native speakers. On Wednesday, February 5, 2020 Palau Community College Science Department Associate Professor Vernice Yuzi and students met with Dr. Cheryl R. Sangueza a lead researcher for the western pacific under UOG/UHH IOA-LSAMP grant.

Dr. Sangueza is on the island conducting exploratory ethnographic interviews and focus group interviews with PCC students enrolled in science related field. The purpose of the research interviews are to understand the cross-cultural beliefs of success in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) program. The results of the interviews will inform the design of effective STEM programs, curricula, and research opportunities for native Hawaiian and Pacific islander students at five universities (UOG, the University of Hawaii at Manoa, the University of Hawaii at Hilo, Chaminade University, and Hawaii Pacific University) and six community colleges (American Samoa Community College, College of the

NOVEL CORONAVIRUS UPDATES



Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) Situation Report Palau Ministry of Health - External Situation Report 3 February 2020 - 10:00 PWT

GLOBAL SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Ministry of Health (MOH) is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (2019-nCoV) that was first detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December of 2019, which has now been exported to several other countries. Person-to-person transmission has occurred among close contacts, including family members in the same household, of confirmed cases and healthcare workers caring for infected patients. WHO Director General declared this outbreak of novel coronavirus as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) on January 30, 2020.

As of February 3, 2020:

- At least 16,789 confirmed cases have been reported for novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) globally; 16,618 cases within mainland China.
- 180 confirmed cases reported outside of mainland China in 26 countries and areas: Thailand, Hong Kong, Australia, France, Malaysia, Singapore, Taiwan, Japan, Macau, South Korea, United States, United Kingdom, Vietnam, Nepal, Canada, Germany, Sri Lanka, Cambodia, United Arab Emirates, Finland, Russia, Italy, India, Sweden, Philippines, and Spain.
- 362 deaths have been reported 361 in mainland China; 1 death in the Philippines.
- · Person-to-person transmission reported in several countries outside of China including the US and Japan.

PALAU READINESS AND RESPONSE

As of February 3, 2020:

- There are NO SUSPECTED CASES of 2019 nCoV in Palau.
- · MOH Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activated on Jan. 22, 2020 to implement preparedness and response measures to minimize the risk of importation and potential local transmission of 2019 n-CoV to Palau.
- · Health screening initiated on Jan. 23, 2020 at Palau International Airport and Malakal seaport to screen all visitors to Palau. Over 2,000 visitors screened at points of entries (PoE) to date. All arriving passengers and crew must declare a health declaration form.
- Preparations being undertaken at the Belau National Hospital (BNH) to receive and care for critically ill suspect cases.
- Risk communication efforts initiated by MOH to relay credible and timely information to stakeholders and relevant information to the public and will continue to provide updates as they become available.
- Executive Order 433 signed by President Tommy Remengesau, Jr. on Jan. 30, 2020 temporarily suspending flights from People's Republic of China, Hong Kong, and Macau to Palau for the month of February.
- Health Alert for travellers issued by MOH on Jan. 30, 2020 recommending avoidance of non-essential travel to mainland China, Hong Kong, and Macau.
- MOH continues to urge the public to practice basic public health measures to prevent respiratory infections:
 - · Respiratory etiquette: cover your cough and sneeze with a clean tissue or your sleeve.
 - · Hand hygiene: Frequent handwashing with soap and warm water.

United States Department of Education Federal Updates

The Department of Education (ED) released the 2020-2021 Pell Grant payment and disbursement schedules, which included a \$150 increase to the maximum Pell Grant award of \$6,345.00

Although \$6,345 is the maximum Pell Grant for the 2020-2021 award year, a student may be eligible to receive Pell funds for up to 150 percent of the student's Pell Grant scheduled award for the award year. To be eligible for additional Pell Grant funds, the student must be eligible to receive Pell Grant funds for the payment period and enrolled at least as a half-time student in the payment period.

Any Pell Grant received will be included in determining the student's Pell Grant duration of eligibility and Lifetime Eligibility Used (LEU). A student's eligibility to receive a Federal Pell Grant is limited to 600% or 12 semesters based on full-time enrollment status or its equivalent.
