### PCC CRE, STEP-UP & PAIR Introduces Coconut Beetle Study

Palau Community College Cooperative Research & Extension, Pacific Academic Institute for Research (PAIR) and STEP UP program have been working on two entomological study. The first of these projects was the Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle also known as "Chermel a Lius" which is an invasive species of beetles that attack coconut trees. Research began in 2015 on the damage caused by Coconut Rhinoceros Beetles (CRB) to coconut trees throughout the islands of Palau. Assessed over 1,500 trees at almost 50 sites from Kayangel to Merir, using an assessment system developed by the Secretariat of the Pacific Community. The study found that approximately 90% of trees assessed showed some damage, but that in most cases the damage was light, and would not affect the yield of the coconuts. There were two known biotypes of CRB in the Pacific Islands: the so-called Pacific type (CRB-P), which has been in the Pacific since the early 1900's, and the Guam type (CRB-G), which was first discovered in Guam in 2007, and is now found in Guam, Hawaii, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, the Solomon Islands, Palau and other sites in Southeast Asia and the Pacific. Palau and the Philippines are the only places in the Pacific known to have both CRB biotypes. The Oryctes nudivirus (OrNV) was detected in beetles from all locations except Sonsorol. Interestingly, the nudivirus was found in several specimens of CRB-G, which is supposedly not susceptible to this virus.

Since we accept students on what is called a rolling basis, there is no set deadline for application. But it is recommended that you apply as early as possible during the year prior to the semester you wish to attend. We will notify you of your admissions status within two weeks of receiving a complete application.
