Thursday, April 9, 2020 - Palau Community College employees were deeply saddened upon learning of the passing of our very own Vice President of Cooperative Research and Extension, Mr. Thomas Taro. Thomas passed away peacefully at his home in Ngermetengel, Ngeremlengui, and was surrounded by his wife Youlsau Ngiraikelau Taro, his children, as well as his sisters, brothers, and family members.

Thomas had been working at PCC for over thirty years (30) having first started as an instructor, then in 1997 he became Director of the Research/Demonstration Station, and in 2000 became Interim Vice President of CRE, assuming full vice presidency in 2005.

As Vice President of PCC-CRE, Thomas oversaw the College's Land Grant program which included research activities that ultimately support local farming and fish farm ventures. He was well known fisherman who liked to fish when he found time, but he is perhaps best known in the Palau Community as the expert on root crops, particularly the many varieties of taro.

The College's thoughts and prayers are with Thomas's family at this time.

PCC General Electronics Technology To Get New Classrooms

Palau Community College Tekrar building which houses General Electronics Technology (GET) program is currently in the process of remodeling to accomodate more instructional classrooms, laboratory, and storage room.

PCC BOT Policy 20-01

On March 27, 2020 Palau Community College Board of Trustees authorized the college administration to deveop and implement appropriate responses to the new coronavirus, COVID 19 to ensure the safety, health and well being of students, faculty, staff and guests, and to minimize disruption to college operations and especially student learning outcomes.

Since December 2019, COVID 19 that was detected in Wuhan, China has rapidly spread globally and has reached 170 countries with over 700,000 confirmed cases and 33,000 deaths.

In accordance with the national government's orders and directives, and the college's commitment to the safety and health of everyone on campus, to date the College has intituted numerous responses.

PCC Board of Trustees recommended policy statement as follows:

It is the policy of Palau Community College to take necessary actions/responses to 1. Protect the safety, health and well-being of its students, faculty, staff, and guests, 2. Ensure minimal disruption to operations and student learning outcomes, 3. Comply with Board Policy 18-01, Emergency Management Policy when appropriate.

Such responses may include shift of instructional delivery mode (online, hybrid, or correspondence), Adjustments to academic calendar, Implementation of new services delivery mode, and Adjustments to student activities and other related school activities.

DENGUE FEVER CASES FALL BELOW OUT-BREAK THRESHOLD

The Ministry of Health (MOH) is informing the public that as of this week, the number of dengue fever cases have fallen below the outbreak threshold of 10 cases-per-month. This signals the end of a 15-month outbreak, which saw a total of 828 cases reported between December 2018 and March 2020 in Palau. Koror - 73% cases reported and Other twelve States had 27% reported cases not including Angaur, Sonsorol, and Hatohobei.

This drop in dengue cases provides some relief however the public is nevertheless encouraged to continue practicing the 3S of Dengue Prevention to prevent the spread or infection of the dengue virus, including:

- Search and eliminate mosquito breeding sites in and around the house and yards.
- Self-protect against mosquito bites by using insect repellent and wearing long-sleeved clothing.
- Seek early consultation if dengue fever symptoms are experienced. For more information contact MOH Communicable Disease Unit at 488-2450
