PCC Library Summer Kids Program Commence

On Monday, June 29, 2020 the Tan Siu Lin Palau Community College (PCC) Library began its Summer Youth Program for ages seven (7) to twelve (12). Over 20 students participated in this one-week program. The library summer activities were established in order to promote interest in reading & writing, art, and mathematics among the younger population of Palau. The library's staff members engaged in this summer activity with the students in order to form a strong comprehension of arts & crafts, numbers and alphabets. Activities included learning how to search using online catalog, phonics, arts & craft, illustrations and bookmaking, fun math games, spelling games, and online trivia & scavenger hunt that will help the children to recognize and reinforce letters, numbers, art, and songs and movies. Activities also gives the opportunity for the library to promote its Kids' Korner Collection, Coral Cafe, and Teen Space by encouraging the students to visit the library for more reading & writing activities.

Learning Methodologies

1. Distance Education:

-**Face-to-Face** (in-person)

-**Online** (student learning takes place fully online)

*Synchronous -Students take the course fully online with scheduled date and time for required virtual meetings during the semester.

*Asynchronous - Students take the course fully online with no scheduled virtual meetings during the semester.

-**Hybrid** (Student learning includes face-to-face and online with scheduled date and time for required face-to-face meeting during the semester).

2. Correspondence:

-**Self-paced Learning**

* Student learning takes place away from the College campus in a different location. The College provides course instructional materials to the students by mail or electronic transmission. Course instructional materials includes required assignments, tests, projects and examination. Student learning is self-paced depending on student time and schedule. All required course activities must be submitted to the course instructor following dates and time indicated in the course syllabus. Student submit work to the instructor by mail, electronic transmission or in-person delivery by the deadline date. Interaction between the student and the instructor is not required throughout the semester; however, if need arises, student initiates the meeting by contacting the instructor to secure a meeting date, time and location.

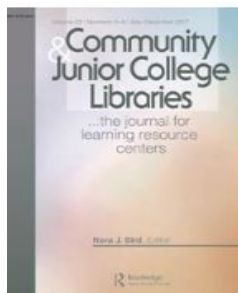

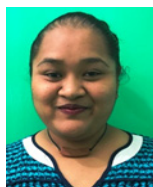

QUARANTINE ENDS FOR ALL 58 REPATRIATED AFTER NEGATIVE COVID-19 TEST RESULTS

The National Emergency Committee (NEC) is pleased to inform the public that all 58 repatriated residents were tested for COVID-19 on Day 14, and all results were negative. As of today, June 26, 2020, all of them join their loved ones at home.

All repatriated individuals were asked to monitor their health for an additional 14 days, and limit their movements and contact with other people. Furthermore, they were given appointments for their last COVID-19 tests on day 7 during their home quarantine.

We would like to remind everyone that these residents have gone through four tests, all of which have been negative for COVID-19. We thank the community for its support and kindness as we welcome our fellow residents back home.
