PCC CRE Continues Support in Local Mangrove Crab Farms

Over the years, the Palau Community College (PCC) has developed a reliable hatchery technique for mangrove crab. In collaboration with the state governments and various organizations such as The Nature Conservancy (TNC), The Environment Inc (TEI), and the local farmers, thousands of mangrove crab juveniles have been released to existing crab farms and known fishery sites in the country. Several millions of larvae were also released near the mangrove areas to rebuild local populations in wild. For this year, since January 2020, a total of 7,000 half inch size juveniles have been released in the Ngermeduu Bay in Ngatpang State and Oikull Village in Airai State on May 22 and 29, 2020, respectively. About 14 million newly hatched larvae were also released along the mangrove channels in the States of Airai, Aimeliik and Ngardmau. PCC also works together with the farmers and various collaborating agencies in establishing a small farm, conducting preliminary stock assessment and monitoring the status of mangrove fishery in the country.

SAFE REPATRIATION OF PALAU RESIDENTS FROM TAIWAN

July 7, 2020

The National Emergency Committee would like to inform the public that on July 7, 2020, a chartered flight brought Palau residents from Taiwan, including four patients and their escorts, four students, and one laboratory specialist who will be assisting the Ministry of Health on COVID-19 related response activities. The chartered flight returned to Taiwan on the same day carrying six medical referral patients and their escorts from Palau.

All individuals have arrived safely and in quarantine. They will be provided all basic necessities including meals and personal hygiene products. However, if families would like to bring them additional items, they may contact the Palau Red Cross Office at 488-5780, located in the Ngirutang Building in Malakal (see attached for Red Cross Delivery Schedule).

We appeal to the community for support as we work together to bring home our people and other essential personnel.
