2020 Thanksgiving Endowment Fundraising Event

Palau Community College (PCC) held its annual Thanksgiving Endowment Fundraising Event on Wednesday November 25, 2020. BOT Chairman Reverend Billy G. Kuartei and PCC President Dr. Tellei gave special remarks via live radio talkshow sponsored by Salvador Tellames from PalauWave Radio. The college fundraising event was able to raise over \$45,000 due to the support of the community members who purchased raffle tickets at \$10 each and cash donations from local businesses, elected government leaders, and community members. Some State government offices and local supporters also donated in-kind prizes for the raffle drawing to help with the PCC Endowment Fundraiser. Also donating from off-island are customary supporters Daniel Roland and Jason Miyashita of Asia Pacific Group of Raymond James with the combined donation of \$2,500. This year, the PCC Thanksgiving Endowment Fundraiser had a total of fifty-four (54) prizes and a grand prize. The grand prize was a 14'x 24' Summer House valued at \$7,000, Baby grand prize were local made machete with sheath, bench with back, and gift certificate.

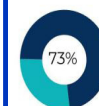

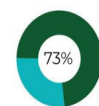

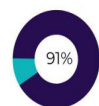
