PCC & SDSU Bachelor's Degree Program Concludes



PCC & SDSU Bachelor's Program cohort

On January 03, 2021 students from the San Diego State University Bachelor's program finally completed the last required course following a program exit evaluation.

The SDSU bachelor's program in collaboration with Palau Community College launched the program in May of 2017 using a facilitated distance learning model. An approach that where students take ownership of their learning and also work in groups while instructors facilitate the classes and providing various learning resources. Dr. Theresa Lally, a Director of Center for Pacific Studies from SDSU is a lead instructor and facilitator of the program.

This is a first SDSU bachelor's cohort with 29 students to enroll, persist and complete the entire program in 3 years. Program course topics range from academic teaching methodologies, adult education, language theories and practices, second language teaching, multi-lingual theory, disability in society to mathematical concepts in education. With hard work and dedication of individual student, the 5th bachelor's cohort successfully complete all required courses.

In observing the annual tradition of the college, students will be participating in the upcoming college commencement exercises to be held in May 2021.

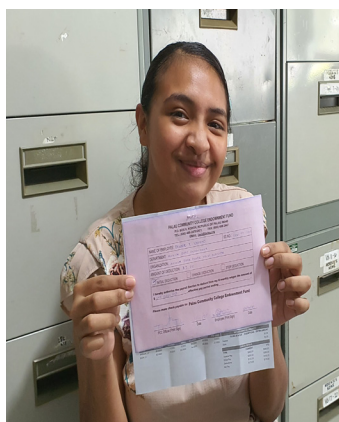

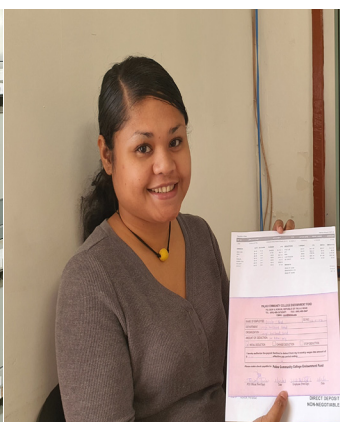
Newest Contributors to the PCC Endowment Fund

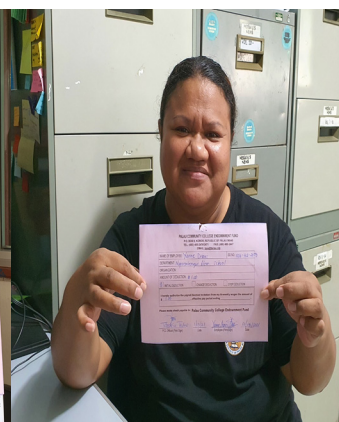
