PCC supports mangrove crab aquaculture project in Ngaraard

To support the development of a sustainable mangrove crab aquaculture in Palau, the PCC-CRE aquaculture staff delivered 115 mangrove crab juveniles to Meriu Wachi's Mangrove Crab Farm in Ngaraard State on January 26, 2021. In addition to this, about 3 million newly hatched mangrove crab larvae were also released along the mangrove channel at the Urung Pier beside the state building. Present during these activities were the Ngaraard State Governor Benjamin Iskawa, Agriculture and Aquaculture project coordinator John Mengidab, crab farmer Meriu Wachi and some members of community. The governor expressed his support on these activities particularly on the establishment of mangrove crab aquaculture and stock enhancement projects in the state. He also encouraged other state leaders to do the same activities to promote food security in the country. The mangrove crab *Scylla serrata*, also known as "mud crab",

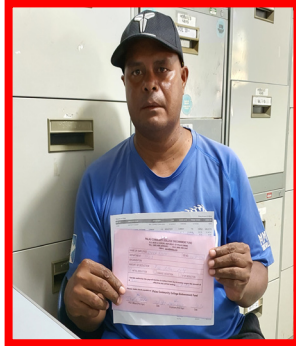
Newest Contributors to the PCC Endowment Fund

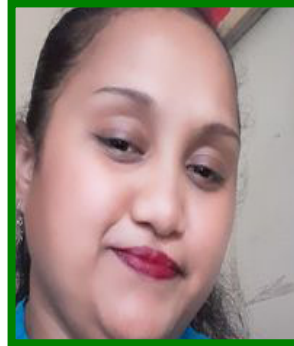

is a high-value and widely sought-after food species in Palau and other islands in Micronesia. Unfortunately, overharvesting, presumably due to increased market demand has led to substantial decline in mangrove crab population through out the Indo-Pacific region. In Palau, efforts have been made by the government and other concerned agencies to strictly regulate the fishing of mangrove crabs by allowing people to catch only those with a carapace length of more than 5 inches, establishing closed season, as well as banning exportation. The development of mangrove crab farming in Palau is essential to meet the demand of local consumers. In 2006, attempts were made to grow mangrove crabs to marketable size, however, continuous production was hampered due to limited supply of seed stocks. Over the decade, the Palau Community College (PCC) has successfully developed mangrove crab hatchery and nursery techniques at the Multi-Species Hatchery in Ngeremlegui State. PCC has been assisting the mangrove crab farmers who grow crabs by proving technical assistance and hatchery produced mangrove crab juveniles (2 to 3 inches in carapace width) for stocking their ponds and netted enclosures inside the mangrove areas. PCC has also been working with several community organizations and state leaders to help enhance the population of mangrove crabs by releasing newly hatched mangrove crab larvae along the mangrove channels and coastal waters. Out of the millions of larvae that were released, only 0.01 percent is expected to recruit in the mangroves due to various circumstances that may affect their survival rate in the wild.

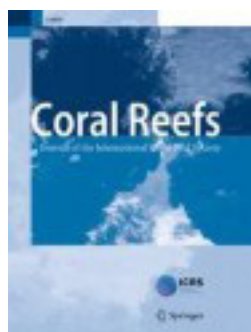
