PCC CRE PARTICIPATES IN SERS ED, LOKALL COOKING CLASS



On May 26 and 27, 2021 PCC Cooperative Research and Extension (CRE) Research and Development Station researchers and agents took part in a two-day Lokall Cooking Class for high school students at Palau High School cafeteria. PCC CRE agriculture program spearhead the cooking class through colloboration with local partners such as Bureau of Agriculture, Taiwan ICDF, Rotary Club of Palau, DeWill2Live, Belau Wellness Center, Inc., Palau High School, Koror State Solid Waste Management, and Pacific Academic Institute for Research (PAIR).

PCC CRE extension agent Felix Sengebau also gave informative presentation on how to start vegetable gardening, decide on ideal gardening location, gardening materials needed, nutrients that gardening plants need, maintenance and care including some challenges in gardening project. The backyard gardening project initiated last year has been very successful in mitigating the need for local household to plant vegetables as part of CRE's food security program.




