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#### THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974 (FERPA)

Annually, Palau Community College informs students of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended. This Act mandates the institution to protect the privacy of educational records. The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) afford students certain rights with respect to their educational records.

2. The right to request changes to the student's educational records that the student believes are inaccurate or misleading. Students may ask the college to change or amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. The request must be in writing which clearly identifies the record or part of the record they want to change and specifies why it is inaccurate or misleading and addressed to the Registrar's Office. If the college decides not to change or amend their record a requested, the student will be notified of the decision and advised of his/her rights to challenge the decision through the Student Review Board.
