On August 19, 2021 Palau Community College Continuing Education conducted a Customer Service training to the Republic of Palau Postal Service employees. The training engages participants on business concepts such as customers' needs, expectation, and most importantly how to solve customers' problem. Topics covered in the training are enhancing relationship between service quality, customer experience and business objectives; tailoring service to meet and exceed customer expectations in real time; improving communication etiquette and service recovery techniques; cultivating positive customer experience and service quality; importance of front-line employees in business; and understanding the basic needs of the customers. This four-hour training will be administered to all postal service workers via a group of seven people at a time. Training instructor is Ms. Victoria Maui, a retired PCC Associate Professor of Tourism & Hospitality program. Trainings are ongoing and will have the awarding ceremony later this week.

SUBJECT : UPDATE ON COVID-19 (CORONA VIRUS)

On Friday, August 20th, the Ministry of Health and Human Services (MHHS) announced the confirmation of two imported positive cases of COVID -19. The two infected individuals arrived on Palau on the August 15th flight from Guam and were identified b the fifth-day mandatory testing. They were immediately isolated (quarantined) and contact tracing is ongoing.

At this point, based on guidance from the MMHS Public Service Announcement on Sunday August 22nd, the College continues its normal operation, including instructional programs and services. However, as advised by MHHS, all students, faculty and staff are urged to remain calm and to continue to practice preventive measures including getting vaccinated, proper and frequent hand-washing, physical distancing, wearing masks when appropriate, cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched objects, limiting large indoor gatherings, covering coughs and sneezes, and calling the hospital for advice if you feel sick or exhibit any or combination of the following symptoms of flu:

- *Fever or feeling feverish/having chills
- *Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- *Fatigue (tiredness)
- *Muscle pain or body aches
- *Cough
- *Sore throat
- *Headache
- *Runny or stuffy nose

Effective today August 23rd until rescinded in writing, all PCC students, employees and customers are required to wear masks inside all buildings including classrooms, shops, offices, Library, etc. Mask wearing is HIGHLY ENCOURAGED if you are on campus grounds. Any College vehicle carrying two (including the driver) or more people will require wearing of masks as well.

Again, everyone is urged to remain calm as we continue our normal operations and await further guidance from the MHHS. Thank you for your understanding and participation in our response to this new virus and the College will provide updates when additional information is received.

UPDATE - TWENTY- FOUR (24) INITIAL CLOSE CONTACTS TEST NEGATIVE ON DAYS 1 AND 3, ADDITIONAL CLOSE CONTACTS TEST NEGATIVE ON DAY 1

The Ministry of Health and Human Services (MHHS) would like to update the public that further nvestigation revealed two more close contacts of the individuals who tested positive¹ of COVID-19 on August 20, 2021, which brings the total of close contacts2 to twenty-six (26).

- The initial twenty-four (24) close contacts had tested negative on Binax antigen and PCR GeneXpert on day 1. They have been tested again on day 3, and their results are negative
- The other two close contacts were also tested using Binax antigen and PCR GeneXpert on their
- day 1 testing, and their results were also negative. They will be tested again on day 3.

 All close contacts remain in quarantine for a total of ten (10) days from last exposure.

MHHS continues to monitor the situation and will update the public as new information become

Again, the public is advised to remain calm and to continue the following preventive measures

- Get vaccinated
- Wash your hands frequently
- · Wear a mask as appropriate
- Consider limiting large indoor gatherings and practice physical distancing, 3-6 feet apart
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and spaces
- . Stay home, away from others and call the Hospital for advice if you are sick
