On February 02, 2022, Palau Community College President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei met with Koror State Government (KSG) Governor Eyos Rudimch to continue discussion to formalized the Koror-PCC Rock Island partnership.

PCC's initial requests in 2018 was based on the college strategic goal to expand and enhance its Environmental & Marine Science degree program as well as build on other college programs such as Tourism & Hospitality and Palauan Studies through the use of designated Koror-PCC rock island. Recently, a follow up meeting between PCC President Dr. Tellei and Governor Rudimch entered into an assurance that such mutual partnership and collaboration has come to fruition.

Under the partnership, the college will assist in developing and installating boat mooring buoys at diving sites close to Metukerikull Koror-PCC Rock Island.

UPDATED ISOLATION & SELF-MONITORING GUIDANCE MINISTRY OF HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES (MHHS)

Due to the changing nature of the COVID-19 cases in Palau, the following changes have been made to isolation and quarantine/ self-monitoring measures.

NEW GUIDELINES FOR ISOLATION (POSITIVE CASES OF COVID-19)

Everyone with COVID-19 must isolate to help prevent spreading it to others. For the next 5-10 days, do the following:

- 1. Wear a mask at all times for 10 days, indoors and outdoors.
- 2. Take measures to prevent the spread to others.
- 3. Stay at home (or at a designated facility) and away from others.
- Tell your close contacts that they have been exposed. They need to follow instruction on Self-Monitoring (see information on the right).
- Follow advice and guidelines from MHHS for Isolation.
- 6. Ending Isolation:

 (W/TH TEST) isolation can end on Day 5 if you test negative on Day 5 (or lare) AND you do not have any fever for at least 24 hours, with improving symptoms. Continue weaking a mask at all immes and avoid large gatherings for 5 more days.

II. (WITHOUT TEST) If no test was conducted on Day 5 or results were positive, isolation can end on Day 10 if symptoms are not present.

NEW GUIDELINES FOR QUARANTINE/ SELF-MONITORING (CLOSE CONTACTS)

Persons who are exposed to someone with COVID-19 must self-monitor their health for 10 days. If you were exposed, you could be infected and spread the virus, even if you feel well and have no symptoms or you had a negative test result in the beginning. For the next 10 days, do the following:

- Wear a mask at all times for 10 days.
 Avoid large gatherings or activities.
- Engage in easential activities only (working, getting food, banking, seeking medical attention).
- Monitor your symptoms (runny nost, sore or setaicity threat, headache, body aches, fatigue, shortness of breath, nausea, vomiting, etc).
- If you develop symptoms (even just a mild one), isolate yourself and seek medical advice or attention.
- Consider testing, especially if you are at increased risk for severe illness or live with someone who is, in order to get medical attention as needed.
- 7. Follow advice and guidelines from MHHS on How to Quarantine/Self-Monitor.
