PCC President Dr. Tellei Facilitates OOC Side Event's Climate Resilience and Sustainable Development in Small Island Developing States







On April 6, 2022, the Environmental Science Club hosted an exciting lecture by Mr. Alex Ferrier-Loh, a Lead Mapping Specialist at Coral Reef Research Foundation (CRRF). An enthusiastic marine biologist, Mr. Alex is responsible for conducting bathymetric surveys around Palau using a Emultibeam echo sounder. He shared his experience with students on how to conduct underwater ocean floor mapping and how such data will provide information for habitat protection, climate adaptation, and infrastructure development. This project has never been done before and he invited student to be part of it by applying for CRRF summer internship for its ongoing underwater mapping project.

ES Students Field Trip to Metukrikull Rock Island

On April 4, 2022, SC110 class of 13 students and 2 science faculties, Vernice Yuji and Rilang Roberto went on an instructional trip to Metukrikull, Rock Island. The purpose of the outdoor excursion was to observe, identify, and classify the different marine invertebrates in their natural habitat and their characteristics. Not only do students get to learn the concepts inside the classroom but also outdoor marine environment offers students the chance to see actual science in action and venture through local habitats which can enhance their interest, knowledge, and motivation.
