CONTINUING EDUCATION SUMMER KIDS PROGRAM COMMENCE

On Monday, June 06, 2022 the Palau Community College Continuing Education (CE) began its Summer Kids Program for ages seven (7) to thirteen (13) currently in grades 3rd to 8th. Over 195 students participated in this three-week program. Students will be learning academic subjects such as Singapore Math, English Reading & Writing, Palauan Orthography, Marine Science, Art, and Music. Students will also participating in cultural and educational activities after class sessions and learn to interact with peers. Continuing Education is working with teachers from local public schools to make this summer program more engaging and educational.

US Dept. of Education Approves Another 5-Year Grant for PCC Upward Bound

The Palau Community College earlier this week received notice from the US Department of Education that its recently submitted Upward Bound Program grant proposal has been approved for funding. According to Upward Bound Program Director Larry Wakakoro, the current funding cycle for the program ends in August this year, and this funding news from the Department of Education comes at a perfect time to guarantee funding availability, allowing much-needed services for Palau students to continue without interruption. This latest Department of Education grant will fund the Upward Bound for another 5-year cycle from 2022-2027, at an average yearly budget of over \$400,000.00 dollars. and is one of the longest-running US funded competitive grant program in Palau. Re-roofing of PCC Temekai Building Continues

Last week, PCC began its significant facelift project. The project is to reinstall new aluminum roof on the existing Temekai building which houses programs and offices such as Construction Technology, Academic Tutoring Center, CTE Lab School, Agricultural Science program and laboratory, Pacific Academic Institute for Research (PAIR), Palau Allied Health Center (AHEC) and Pacific Island Health Officers Association (PIHOA).

The project will require over seven hundred aluminum roof and 780 lumbers to cover the roof area of 7,500 square foot.

The project is an effective way to save on energy cost by reducing heat and preserving cold air in the building especially offices and classroom equip with airconditioning system.
