REU researchers on the uniqueness and importance of these projects. So far it's been a great experience and we have learned many new and exciting ways of science that we will bring back home to share with those who could not have this opportunity.

Macy Nagata's mentor is Dr. Kiana Frank of Lab Hui O Frank. Her lab studies microbiology while merging it with indigenous knowledge. The research I am conducting this summer is on nitrogen-fixing bacteria that are found in taro patches and how their abundance is affected by planting styles. It requires me to sample soil and conduct several DNA processes. Rachel K. Ngiraklang is also mentored by Dr. Kiana Frank. Her project studies the survivability of staph, a virulent pathogen, in both fresh and brackish water. Most of her work is conducted in the lab, where she filters water samples and records the number of staph colonies. Bryce KB Bonicacio's mentor is Dr. Bob Richmond. He will be focusing on marine science. His project is on the impacts of sediment on coral and sea urchin fertilization. He tests sediment in certain concentrations to determine its effects on coral and sea urchin gametes.

## Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), the Commission Third-Party Comment

A third-party comment assists the Commission as it considers applications for candidacy, accreditation, or reaffirmation of accreditation. When an institution is undergoing a review, the Commission requires the institution's chief executive officer to notify the campus community and public of the opportunity for submission of third-party comments and the process for doing so. Any member of the college community or public may submit a third-party comment by completing the Commission's online third-party comment form, available via the institution's website or ACCJC's website. In order to ensure evaluation of applicable third-party comments by the peer review team, third-party comments should be received by the Commission staff no later than five weeks before the peer review team visit.

Palau Community College will submit its Institutional-Self Evaluation Report (ISER) to the Commission no later than August 1, 2022; Teams ISER is October 4, 2022; and the College Focus Site Visit is scheduled during the week of March 13, 2023. Should any member of the College community or the public who may wish to submit a third-party comment must complete the Commission's online third-party comment form available at https://accjc.org/forms/third-party-comments/.

The third-party comment should be received by the Commission five weeks prior to March 13, 2023.
