TAIWAN INTERNATIONAL YOUTH AMBASSADORS VISIT PCC CAMPUS

On August 29, 2022 the Taiwan International Youth Ambassadors (TIYA) visited PCC campus and met with PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei and PCC students at the Assembly Hall.

PCC Student Services Division in partnership with ROC-Taiwan Embassy arranged for the meeting and dialogue between students from Taiwan and PCC. According to Dean of Students, there are forty TIYA students from twenty universities in Taiwan visiting PCC. The group was led by Director-General Constance Hsueh-hong Wang from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Their visit to Palau was to promote cultural exchange, dialogue on climate change, and marine conservation.

TIYA students also showcased traditional folk arts via presentation that expressed Taiwan buildings, clothings, and wood designs and performed traditional dance and music that represented history and human expressions.

At the end of the program, PCC students joined TIYA students in a group dialogue to share information about Palau's history, culture, education, marine environment, and climate change. While here in Palau, TIYA visited ROP President Surangel Whipps, Jr. and government and non government agencies to learn more about Palau and its people.

A Memorandum of Understanding entered between Palau Community College (PCC) and Ministry of Justice (MOJ) set forth conditions for the MOJ In-Service Officers Cohort for Fall 2022 to Summer 2024. Officers selected for this cohort need to upgrade their skills and knowledge and will enroll in the Criminal Justice Program. PCC will group the officers based on their educational level or courses already completed and will have two consecutive school years to complete the program with an Associate of Science degree. Eleven in-service officers are selected for this first CJ program cohort. PCC Dean of Academic Affairs Deikola Olikong, Associate Dean Marianne Temaungil, Dean of Students Hilda N. Reklai, Associate Professor Samantha Bells, and Director Lesley Adachi represent the college in discussion with Vice President/Minister of Justice J. Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), the Commission Third-Party Comment

A third-party comment assists the Commission as it considers applications for candidacy, accreditation, or reaffirmation of accreditation. When an institution is undergoing a review, the Commission requires the institution's chief executive officer to notify the campus community and public of the opportunity for submission of third-party comments and the process for doing so. Any member of the college community or public may submit a third-party comment by completing the Commission's online third-party comment form, available via the institution's website or ACCJC's website. In order to ensure evaluation of applicable third-party comments by the peer review team, third-party comments should be received by the Commission staff no later than five weeks before the peer review team visit.

Palau Community College will submit its Institutional Self-Evaluation Report (ISER) to the Commission no later than August 1, 2022; Teams ISER is October 4, 2022; and the College Focus Site Visit is scheduled during the week of March 13, 2023. Should any member of the College community or the public who may wish to submit a third-party comment must complete the Commission's online third-party comment form available at https://accjc.org/forms/third-party-comments/.

The third-party comment should be received by the Commission five weeks prior to March 13, 2023.
