Tellei, Vice President of Administration & Finance Jay Olegeriil, Vice President of CRE Dr. Christopher Kitalong, Dean of Academic Affairs Deikola Olikong, Dean of Students Hilda N. Reklai, Dean of Continuing Education Hedrick Kual, and ASPCC President Weber Santiago. #### U.S. Constitution Celebration Winning Essay by Weber Santiago

#### A Palauan's Reflection on Two Hundred and Thirty-Five Years of the American Constitution

The relationship between the United States of America and the Republic of Palau is unique. These two nations are different in culture and ethnicity yet value many of the same things, and these shared values are enshrined in their respective Constitutions. Though the Constitution of the United States is nearing its two hundred and thirty-fifth year, the Palauan Constitution has recently surpassed its forty-second year; the two documents share many similarities indicative of their nations' close ties. Both documents share similar origins and are inspired by the history of common law shared by the world. The two also protect similar rights that are at times expressed in uniform language, and both are dedicated to the progress towards equality.

The American Constitution was drafted with the guidance of philosophies of old and new. Though the document was new and revolutionary in 1787, the ideas behind it already existed and were already enshrined in similar documents in the Old World. The stark difference between those documents, like the English Bill of Rights and the Magna Carta, and the American Constitution was that the latter not only took inspiration from the former, it expanded and refined their content. Law, like a house, is as strong as its foundation. Brick upon brick, the common law that we know today is the basis of many of Palau's laws, and its Constitution took form over centuries. Like its American counterpart, the Palauan Constitution takes inspiration from the old and the new. Etched into it are the words and ideas of the English barons that fought for the Magna Carta, French philosophers like John Locke, and the founding fathers who authored the American Constitution. The Constitutions of both nations are derived from a line of common law that has existed for centuries, and both are related to each other in this sense.

This relation is most prevalent in the shared protections and language of both texts. Even in the first lines of both Constitutions, we see these similarities. Both documents in their preamble state the underlying principle of governance by consensus by stating, "We the People." The rights expressed in Article IV (Fundamental Rights) of the Palau Constitution are almost similar to what is stated in the Bill of Rights, specifically the first ten amendments to the American Constitution that set forth the fundamental rights of all Americans. This similarity goes beyond the written protections, Article XV Section 5 of the Palauan Constitution and the 9th amendment of the American Constitution both, in writing, express the existence of unwritten rights and serve as disclaimers. Equality has always meant different things to different people. With the adoption of the Fourteenth Amendment of the American Constitution in 1868, equal protection under the law was afforded to all. In Article IV Section 5 of the Palauan Constitution, equal rights were afforded to all with respect to social status, clan affiliation, race, religion, and amongst others. Though both countries may not be perfect in ensuring equality for all, the essence of equality exists in both documents and because of this, it has allowed for the progression toward actual equality for all in both nations.

The Constitution of the United States, its creation, and its subsequent amendments (specifically those after the Bill of Rights) are the results of trial and error. The American Constitution itself was created to supplant the already existing, and failing, Articles of Confederation (the written government charter that preceded the Constitution). Two hundred and thirty-five years after the Constitution's inception and after countless changes, the ink that was put on paper on September 16, 1787, is still prevalent in the lives of many in the world today. This prevalence is most apparent by looking at Palau's Constitution. In its origins, protections, language, and dedication to equality, we see hints of red, white, and blue.



### Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), the Commission Third-Party Comment

A third-party comment assists the Commission as it considers applications for candidacy, accreditation, or reaffirmation of accreditation. When an institution is undergoing a review, the Commission requires the institution's chief executive officer to notify the campus community and public of the opportunity for submission of third-party comments and the process for doing so. Any member of the college community or public may submit a third-party comment by completing the Commission's online third-party comment form, available via the institution's website or ACCJC's website. In order to ensure evaluation of applicable third-party comments by the peer review team, third-party comments should be received by the Commission staff no later than five weeks before the peer review team visit.

Palau Community College will submit its Institutional Self-Evaluation Report (ISER) to the Commission no later than August 1, 2022; Teams ISER is October 4, 2022; and the College Focus Site Visit is scheduled during the week of March 13, 2023. Should any member of the College community or the public who may wish to submit a third-party comment must complete the Commission's online third-party comment form available at https://accjc.org/forms/third-party-comments/.

The third-party comment should be received by the Commission five weeks prior to March 13, 2023.
