Palau Community College (PCC) held its annual Thanksgiving Endowment Fundraising Event on Wednesday, November 23, 2022. BOT Chairman Reverend Billy G. Kuartei, PCC President Dr. Tellei, BOT Secretary/Treasurer Kione Isechal, Student Trustee O'Keef Kokichi, and ASPCC Treasurer Kesiil Thomas gave special remarks via live radio talkshow courtesy of Ministry of State Eco Paradise 87.9 FM Radio. The college fundraising event was able to raise over \$55,000 due to the support of the community members who purchased raffle tickets at \$10 each and cash donations from local businesses, elected government leaders, individual, and local womens' group. Some local businesses also donated in-kind prizes for the raffle drawing to help with its fundraising drive. Also ticket buyers from Guam helped the traditional fundraising a success including Asia Pacific Group of Raymond James. This year, the College fundraising had a total of 55 prizes including Baby Grand Prize and the Grand Prize. Grand Prize was a 14' x 24' Summer House valued at \$9,500

## Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), the Commission Third-Party Comment

A third-party comment assists the Commission as it considers applications for candidacy, accreditation, or reaffirmation of accreditation. When an institution is undergoing a review, the Commission requires the institution's chief executive officer to notify the campus community and public of the opportunity for submission of third-party comments and the process for doing so. Any member of the college community or public may submit a third-party comment by completing the Commission's online third-party comment form, available via the institution's website or ACCJC's website. In order to ensure evaluation of applicable third-party comments by the peer review team, third-party comments should be received by the Commission staff no later than five weeks before the peer review team visit.

Palau Community College's Focus Site Visit is scheduled during the week of March 13, 2023. Should any member of the College community or the public who may wish to submit a third-party comment must complete the Commission's online third-party comment form available at https://accjc.org/forms/third-party-comments/.

The third-party comment should be received by the Commission five weeks prior to March 13, 2023.
