


PCC IT DEPARTMENT FACILITATING TECHNOLOGICAL Self Efficacy Trainings

ETS participants from EBHS Experience the Beautiful Underwater Paradise at Southern Lagoon

Participants from Emmaus Bethania High School's Educational Talent Search Program(ETS) went on a field trip to Milky Way, Jellyfish Lake, Rose Garden, Cemetery Reef, Soft Coral, and Clam City on April 22, 2023. Students studied the marine life of Palau's waters throughout the whole field trip. The white sediment mud bath at Milky Way, which is claimed to be a natural spa experience, was set to be taught and experienced for the first time by the students. Few students who visited there for the first time were astounded by the mud as it was; nevertheless, they were unaware that it smelled like swampy mangrove mud.

All of the students were fascinated by the various destinations and their distinctiveness during the entire trip, which had a variety of marine life, including diverse species and water temperatures. Students, particularly those who had never been to the majority of the locations, were astounded by the variety of species they saw while snorkeling at Rose Garden, Soft Coral, Cemetery Reef, Clam City, and Jellyfish Lake, including jellyfish, clams, and even various types of corals and fish.

The field trip is a component of the Educational Talent Search Program (ETS), which is made available to participants so they may learn about marine life in science class and have a chance to see it firsthand. The students will have the chance to write an essay or discuss what they learned after the field trip so that they can demonstrate their understanding of what they learned in class as well as their ability to have firsthand experience with what they are studying.

UB Workshop Highlights Communicable Disease Safety and Prevention



MOH-CDU staff educate students on various communicable diseases

Last Friday, Ms. Bieb Olikong who is the Program Coordinator at the Communicable Disease Unit (CDU) with the Palau Ministry of Health & Human Services was on campus with her staff educators to speak at the Upward Bound Program's monthly workshop on the topic of Health Education. Olikong and staff shared with students the importance of educating themselves with the different kinds of deadly communicable diseases such as HIV/AIDS, Syphilis, Gonorrhea & Chlamydia, Tuberculosis, and Viral Hepatitis. They outlined the serious health risks of the diseases and how they can be easily transmitted among teens, especially those who are sexually dynamic and indiscriminate. Olikong during her talk said despite the prevalence of these diseases in Palau, anyone including students can easily protect themselves by following the ABCs of Communicable Diseases: A – Abstain, B – Be Faithful, C – Condomize. The workshop format which assembled students into smaller working groups made it easier for students to interact with the presenters and allowed them to openly ask questions and thereby learning more as a result. The Upward Bound students and staff extend appreciation to guest speaker Ms. Olikong and her health educators Aczena Fleetwood, Iolanny T. Dwight, Vanessa T. Abraham, Mouana A. West, and Dilmouais Ngiratrang of the Communicable Disease Unit-Ministry of Health & Human Services.

Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), the Commission Third-Party Comment

A third-party comment assists the Commission as it considers applications for candidacy, accreditation, or reaffirmation of accreditation. When an institution is undergoing a review, the Commission requires the institution's chief executive officer to notify the campus community and public of the opportunity for submission of third-party comments and the process for doing so. Any member of the college community or public may submit a third-party comment by completing the Commission's online third-party comment form, available via the institution's website or ACCJC's website. In order to ensure evaluation of applicable third-party comments by the peer review team, third-party comments should be received by the Commission staff no later than five weeks before the peer review team visit.

Palau Community College's Focus Site Visit is scheduled during the week of March 13, 2023. Should any member of the College community or the public who may wish to submit a third-party comment must complete the Commission's online third-party comment form available at https://accjc.org/forms/third-party-comments/.

The third-party comment should be received by the Commission five weeks prior to March 13, 2023.
