## Upward Bound Classic Hosts Rock Island Trip to Participants



On Friday, June 30,2023, Upward Bound Program participant went on a Science Field Trip to Omekang Rock Island. Accompanying the students was their science instructor Rilang Roberto who was assisted by Lauren M. Wetzel, a post-graduate marine science scholar from U.S. Both Roberto and Wetzel shared with students about how the initial coral formations came about as a result of volcanic activity which pushed the coral limestones above the surface of the water. Then over time through the process of erosion from the ebb and flow of tide and saltwater waves, the coral limestone formations were formed and shaped into what are now famously known as the Rock Islands of Palau.

Roberto and Wetzel also explained to students about the importance of Palau's marine ecosystem and the surrounding ocean and how it is significant to the well-being and livelihood of the people of Palau.

## UBMS Cultural Trip to Kayangel State



On Friday, July 7<sup>th</sup> PCC Upward Bound Math & Science students participated in a field trip to Kayangel State. Students and staff took a whole day tour of the northern state to learn about its unique landscape, flora & fauna, and endemic plants. Endemic tree plants are used for consumption, building materials, and local medicine. Students also had the opportunity to visit Grid connected Solar System which provides electric power to the entire island.



Dear Dr. Tellei:

The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, Western Association of Schools and Colleges, at its meeting June 7-8, 2023, reviewed the Institutional Self-Evaluation Report (ISER) and evidentiary materials submitted by Palau Community College. The Commission also considered the Peer Review Team Report (Team Report) prepared by the peer review team that conducted its site visit to the College March 15-17, 2023.

The purpose of this review was to determine whether the College continues to meet ACCJC's Eligibility Requirements, Commission Policies, and Accreditation Standards (hereinafter, the Standards). Upon consideration of the written information noted above, the Commission acted to **Reaffirm Accreditation for seven years**.

#### Commendations

Commendations signify institutional practices for which the Commission believes exceed Standards. The Commission recognizes the exemplary performance of Palau Community College in the following areas.

Standard I.A.2, I.B.9, IV.B.6 (Commendation 1): The Commission commends the College and its leadership for its ongoing commitment to institutional effectiveness. Palau Community College's 15-Year Institutional Master Plan (YIMP) sustains not only the college, but the entire state of Palau in areas of conservation and workforce innovation opportunities congruent to its mission.

Compliance Requirements

None.

Recommendations for Improving Institutional Effectiveness None.

#### Next Steps

The Peer Review Team Report provides details of the peer review team's findings, including areas of noteworthy practice. The guidance and recommendations contained in the Peer Review Team Report represent the best advice of the team at the time of the visit but may not describe all that is necessary for the college to improve. A final copy of the Peer Review Team Report is attached.

The Commission requires that you disseminate the ISER, the Peer Review Team Report, and this letter to all campus constituencies and the public by placing copies on the College website within seven business days of your receipt. Please note that in response to public interest in accreditation, the Commission requires institutions to post current accreditation information on a Web page no more than one click from the institution's home page. In keeping with ACCJC policy, the Commission action will also be posted on the ACCJC website within 30 days of the date of the Commission's action.

The next report from the College will be the Midterm Report<sup>1</sup> due on March 15, 2027. The institution's next comprehensive review will begin with Team ISER Review in the fall term of 2029 and conclude with a Focused Site Visit in the spring term of 2030.

On behalf of the Commission, we wish to express appreciation for the diligent work and thoughtful reflection that Palau Community College undertook to prepare for this review. These efforts confirm that peer review can serve the multiple constituencies of higher education by both ensuring and encouraging institutional quality and effectiveness.
