FIRST COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS TRAINING CONCLUDES

On July 25, 2023 twelve Community Health Workers (CHWs) graduated at PCC's Ngermetengel, Ngeremlengui Conference Center site after six-months of academic and clinical training. The CHW Training Program, the first of three planned cohorts, was funded through U.S. Federal funds and conducted by the Ministry of Health and Human Services (MHHS) with PCC as a major stakeholder. The Graduates also received Certificates in Homecare Training conducted and awarded by PCC. Additionally, the CHWs were trained in health topics including COVID-19, Non-Communicable Disease, Maternal Child Health, Behavioral and Emergency Health, Environmental Health and Wellness. PCC also supported the training with an intensive course in English Fluency and Study Skills.

The CHWs, after a three-month supervised Internship, will serve as community-based frontline screeners looking to prevent, detect and refer high blood pressure, diabetes, and respiratory diseases and select cancers.

They are Dora Mae Ngiratereked (Ngarchelong State), Germaine Beltau (Ngaraard State), Laeticia Sekool (Ngaraard State), Glenda Mechadelchutem (Ngeremlengui State), Leona Teblak (Ngeremlengui State), Limei Fritz (Ngeremlengui State), Risong Andres (Melekeok State), Mayva Masters (Airai State), Athena Stephanus (Airai State), Mistica Pedro (Sonsorol State), Davy Ann Pedro (Sonsorol State), and Kiana Theodore (Sonsorol State).

The CHW Cohort 2 is in the process of recruiting interested individuals to join other health workers in the community. Recruitment efforts will focus primarily on Airai State and Koror State.
