Palau faces significant challenges due to climate change, threatening its unique cultural heritage and historical sites. The Technical University Berlin and the German Archaeological Institute are therefore developing workshops and trainings for cultural heritage management. Two aspects are in focus – the preservation of Bai construction techniques and the establishment of archaeology as a career choice.

The traditional construction techniques employed in building Bai hold profound cultural significance for Palau. State-of-the-art digitization techniques represent a valuable tool for precisely and efficiently documenting the intricate details of constructions, including traditional Bai structures in Palau. Methods such as Lidar scans and 3D photogrammetry in combination with manual building documentation-Continued on PAGE 2

enable comprehensive, detailed, and high-resolution capture of architectural elements, ensuring a faithful representation of the original structures.

By leveraging such methods, researchers and preservationists can create detailed digital records that not only aid in conservation efforts but also facilitate scholarly analysis and public engagement with Palau's rich cultural heritage.

Organizing a summer school presents an opportunity to immerse students in archaeological techniques directly in the field. This includes conducting an educational excavation at a site identified through previous geoarchaeological work, where significant discoveries are anticipated. Through hands-on experience, students will engage with Palauan history and archaeology while utilizing state-of-the-art technology, and contributing meaningfully to ongoing research. Moreover, this initiative seeks to raise awareness and appreciation for archaeology as a viable career choice, particularly pertinent amidst the increasing development projects in Palau and the threats that climate change poses to archaeological sites.




