## Noontime Seminar with Doctor Kühlem

On February 15, 2024, Dr. Annette Kühlem, an archaeologist of the German Archaeological Institute, had the opportunity to hold a noontime seminar. During the seminar, she spoke about her projects in Palau, her plans for future projects and the reason for these projects. The projects are a result of German-Palau Cooperation in Archaeology. Her presentation's focus was on the Monumental Earthworks of Babeldaob and the Challenges of Climate Change. As said in a brochure provided by Dr. Kühlem and her team, "The monumental earthworks of Palau are one of the most awe-inspiring expressions of human ingenuity in all of Oceania. These terraced and shaped hills still dominate the landscape of the island of Babeldaob today. The earthworks of Palau are a testament to social complexity, successful adaptation, and in-depth knowledge of the landscape. The genesis, function of these impressive archaelogical sites have fascinated researchers of over 100 years." With that said, she has researched and found details of human remains in the grounds of Ngkeklau and Aimeliik that are at least 1700 years old. Because of their technological advances, they are able to take pictures and send them to Germany for research, so as not to disturb the burial sites. ## PCC PRESIDENT MEETS WITH MHRCTD MINISTER AND GUESTS

On February 13, 2024, PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei met with Ms. Doris Schäffler, Mr. Thomas Schubert, Honorary Consul Federal Republic of Germany, Ms. Katharina Sahm, Technical University Berlin, Mr. Ngiraibelas Tmetuchl, Minister of Human Resource, Culture, Tourism and Development, Dr. Annette Kühlem, German Archaeological Institute, Dr. Constanze Dupont, and Prof. Dr. Thekla Schulz-Brize, Technical University of Berlin. Their meeting was regarding Collaborations and Workshops on Cultural Heritage Management. Palau faces significant challenges due to climate change, threatening its unique cultural heritage and historical sites. Apart from its effects on cultural heritage climate change also has a profound impact on Palau's sustainability, particularly concerning its dive tourism industry, upon which the nation heavily relies. The deterioration of coral reefs and marine ecosystems due to rising sea temperatures and ocean acidification poses a significant threat to the biodiversity that attracts tourists to Palau's waters. Therefore, a multifaceted approach is necessary, not only to preserve cultural heritage but also to diversify Palau's tourism offerings towards cultural tourism, which can contribute-

-they reburied the burial sites as a show of respect. Along with the remains were shards of glasses that were sent to Germany for testing. Surprisingly, the glasses were originated from Egypt. Based on Dr. Kühlem and her team's analysis, they are around 1800 years old.

Dr. Kühlem and her team, although focused on their research, are also interested in making sure the community is aware of their research. They have reached out and visited high schools to share their findings as well as brought the students out to their sites to experience the research first-hand.

The archaeological team's purpose is to provide trainings and workshops in Cultural Heritage Management, which branches out to include digitization of museum objects, digitization of buildings and large objects, and construction documentation. This is where their study of the Palau Men's Meeting House (Bai) comes in. Lidar scans and 3D photogrammetry in combination with manual building documentation have helped in capturing the Bai, the human remains, the terraces and their details that will be sent to Germany for further study; they will also be kept in our Belau National Museum for anyone interested to see the exhibit.

The proposed partnership between the TU Berlin, the German Archaeological Institute, the Ministry of Human Resources, Culture, Tourism and Development, the Ministry of Education, the Palau Community College (PCC), PVA, and the Belau National Museum aims to address the challenges of cultural preservation in Palau. By providing workshops and trainings in archaeology, architecture, building research, remote sensing, and education, we seek to safeguard Palau's rich cultural heritage for future generations while promoting meaningful engagement with its past.

The project also seeks to promote the development of cultural tourism as a sustainable alternative to dive tourism, thereby contributing to the resilience of Palau's economy amidst environmental challenges. The main objective of the program is capacity building in the field of heritage management and that the participants of the workshops continue to develop and extend the programs using the provided tools. All results and raw data will be made available to Palauan partner institutions.


