Mr. Vincent Gadngay Abedneko is a PhD student studying in NSYSU under Professor Chin Chang Hung. Professor Hung and PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei met earlier this year to discuss cooperation to provide Taiwan professors to possibly teach courses at the college.

The purpose of the internship is to expose the youth to sustainable aquaculture and horticulture development to promote a healthy way of living. They also brought to the audience's attention the importance of having knowledge of our island's plants and animals. For example, one of the presenter's mentioned dengue fever, and how to distinguish the difference of male and female mosquitos in order to avoid the females, as they are the gender who spread the virus. In addition to that, Palau has a few species of mosquitos and only some of them are able to carry the virus. Another presenter explained why we should know taro plants and where to plant them, as salinity affects their growth. PCC thanks CRE for recruiting students and molding them to be attentive of our environment as it is a crucial natural resource.


