On July 28 to August 1, 2024, Palau Community College hosted the Western Association of Educational Opportunity Personnel (WESTOP)- Pacific Islands Chapter, Professional Development Seminar (PDS). Off-island participants arrived on the 28th and they include those from Guam, FSM, and Hawaii. WESTOP includes professional staff and students who support TRIO Programs, Gear Up, C.A.M.P. and many other federal- and state-based educational equity programs and they hold their seminars every year. Palau Community College (PCC) was fortunate to have President of WESTOP Ms. Dalia Hernandez join the seminar. Days one to three of the seminar were for workshops and trainings and the last day was for all the participants to visit the rock island called Kemurbeab. Ms. Faimau is a first-generation college student at Northern Arizona University studying Biomedical Sciences. Supervised by Ms. Sayaka Naito, CRE's JICA laboratory volunteer, they have been hard at work bringing life back into the lab through various laboratory and experimental set ups. Through her internship, she mentored this year's Pacific STEP-UP students and other work-study students by training them on DNA extraction and polymerase chain reaction, DNA analysis, writing scientific abstracts, and implementing protocols to build research capacity within the facility. Thank you, Ms. Marinca Faimau for your invaluable contributions to the research and development of PCC-CRE and to its mission. We wish you well and good luck on all your future endeavours.
