On September 12, 2024 Palau Community College in partnership with Palau Media Council sponsored the Presidential Debate 2024 at the college auditorium. Present candidates were the President of Palau, His Excellency Surangel Whipps Jr., and Tommy Remengesau Jr. The forum questions were on four thematic areas: economy, foreign affairs, culture and governance. Candidates were given four minutes for opening and closing statements, three minutes for responding to each questions and two minutes for rebuttal. The forum moderators were Mr. JB Victorino and Ms. Ngerchelei Titiml. The program's emcee was Mr. Kambes Kesolei and closing remarks were given by Ms. Leilani Reklai, both from Palau Media Council. The candidates were given a basket to choose a question randomly on each thematic area. Questions were about the Palau Goods and Services Tax (PGST), the rising outmigration of Palauans, the increasing use of illegal drugs, the relationship between Palau and the United States and the military activities taking place, Palau's educational system of year-round school years, and many other essential topics.
