# Noontime Seminar: From Risk To Resilience: Navigating Foreign Investment

On December 10, 2024, co-founders of Pacific Economics based in Hawai'i, Mr. Jarod Baker and Mr. Jake Hamstra came to Palau Community College (PCC) Assembly Hall to hold a Noontime Seminar regarding foreign investment in the Pacific, with a focus on trends, opportunities, and challenges in Palau. Pacific Economics is a strategic advisory firm for tailored economic and policy analysis. They specialize in political economy, development finance, and policy analysis, with a unique focus on the Pacific region. They have visited numerous Pacific islands to do the same research, however they reiterated that every country is researched and analyzed differently as the economies and development vary. During their presentation, they discuessd Palau's investment landscape, patterns of risk and paths to resilience. The audience consisted of representatives of organizations in Palau, such as National Development Bank and Foreign Investment Bank, and many others who asked questions, which led an insightful discussion. ## PEACEWINDS AT PCC: SCREENING AND TOURING

On December 5 and 6, 2024, Peace Winds were stationed at the PCC Assembly Hall to do a free health screening. Peace Winds is a non-governmental organization that launched its first health screening ship, called the Kensing (Japanese for "check-up"), in September 2021 to serve the Republic of Palau. The Peace Winds Palau team is working to bring health screenings to some of Palau's most remote islands. Their doctors and nurses welcome patients aboard the Kensing health ship where they receive free check-ups for metrics like height, weight, and blood pressure. The Kensing is also equipped to provide more in-depth tests such as blood and urine screenings or even EKGs and ultrasounds. On October 1, 2024 Peace Winds' new medical ship, the Kensing II, was unveiled at a ceremony with His Excellency President Surangel Whipps, Jr. and other leaders. This larger, betterequipped ship replaces the previous one in its mission to bring healthcare to Palau's remote Southwest Islands. In addition to providing health screenings with the help of the Kensing, the Peace Winds Palau team works to educate Palau's public about healthy habits to mitigate the incidents of Non-communicable Diseases (NCDs) in the first place. This includes hosting booths at Palau's night markets where residents can meet the Kensing mascot, Toktang the surgeonfish; receive basic health checks like blood pressure tests; and speak to doctors and nurses about how to best manage their health. Other than stationing at PCC Assembly Hall, they have also stationed at Civic Center. They have screened more than 400 community members. All in all, they have accomplished an immense number of projects for the benefit of Palau and its residents. Thank you for all your hard work!

# PCC CRE STAFF AT ANGAUR TO COMBAT RHINOCEROS BEETLES IN BETELNUT AND COCONUT TREES

The battle is on to combat the invasive Coconut Rhinoceros Beetles infecting our coconut and betelnut trees in Angaur. The PCC Cooperative Research and Extension (CRE) has been called to Angaur state to analyze the effects of the Rhinoceros Beetle and find ways to combat the increasing population, which has now damaged almost half of the state's betelnut and coconut trees. Some CRE staff have attended workshops on combating this animal and have been researching all Palau states to analyze its negative impacts and how to find solutions to minimize their population. CRE students and staff assisted and taught the residents in tools, traps and techniques for controlling the animal. They were also able to send back to the state a bait prototype.
