NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER



On Monday, January 20, 2025, PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei, with members of the college and the public attended the 2025 National Day of Prayer held at the Ngermalk at 7:00 a.m. January 20, 2025, was declared a National Day of Prayer for the Republic of Palau according to Presidential Proclamation 24-388. The declaration follows the enactment of RPPL 10-6 in 2017, which established the need for an annual National Day of Prayer to be observed in January. The proclamation affirms Palau's constitution's acknowledging the guidance of the Almighty God, as enshrined in the preamble of the nation's Constitution.

On January 16, 2025, the Republic of Palau transitioned into its 12th Constitutional Government with the installation of the new leadership at the national capital in Ngerulmud, Melekeok state. The inauguration ceremony included the leadership of both the legislative and the executive branches of the government, the traditional and state leaders, dignitaries of our island's diplomatic allies, as well as members of the public. The ceremony began with the introduction and seating of honored guests by Chief of Staff of the President Ms. Landisang Kotaro and Mr. Anthony Rudimch, followed by presentation of colors and prayers. PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei, chairman of the Inauguration Committee then gave opening remarks, highlighting the history of Palau's constitutional government. Then came the core of the program in which the new Vice President Raynold Arnold Oilouch received his oath of office from Senior Judge of the Land Court Rosemary Skebong and President Surangel Whipps, Jr. received his oath of office from Chief Justice Oldiais Ngiraikelau. With the support of the college and our island nation, we wish the 12th Constitutional Government success in the next four years.



NOONTIME SEMINAR: PPUC

On January 17, 2025, the Palau Public Utilities Corporation (PPUC) held a Noontime Seminar at Palau Community College (PCC) Assembly Hall. The Chief Executive Officer Frank Kyota along with many of their staff in different divisions were able to attend. The staff include Mr. Torual Gibbons, Mr. Anthony Rudimch, Ms. Resa Olivares, Ms. Mariah Okada, Mr. Joe Anastacio, Ms. Isebong Rengulbai, Ms. Koch Emesiochel, Ms. Kaya Solomon, Mrs. Donna Titiml, Ms. Pua Ngiraswei, Mr. Albert Philip, Mr. Marson Aderiano, Ms. Eden Benhart, Ms. Ashlee Palacios, and Mr. Ruetei Ikertang. The presentation was about Understanding the Increase in Water and Wastewater Rates, "Ensuring Sustainable and Reliable Services." They explained the brief history of rate adjustments as well as the drivers of cost increase, the corporation's recent improvements, available assistance, and gave brief explanations on how they calculated the new rates. Reasons for the increased rates include regular clean-ups, emergency interventions, repairs, inflation, aging infrasstructures to name a few. Achieving full cost recovery is essential for operating and maintaining infrastructure, ensures compliance with environmental regulations and promotes financial sustainability. PCC and the public extends its gratitude to PPUC for its never ending commitment to serve everyone who resides in Palau.
