On March 5, 2025 from 9am to 3:30pm, Palau Community College (PCC) had the privilege of hosting a visit from Tokai University students and staff. Tokai University is a private university established by Dr. Shigeyoshi Matsumae in 1942. "Tokai" of "Tokai University" refers to the sea to the east of Asia, namely the Pacific Ocean, and symbolizes the desire to foster a rich spirit and broad perspectives. Tokai University consists of 7 campuses in Sapporo, Takanawa, Yoyogi, Shonan, Isehara, Shimizu and Kumamoto. These are comprised of 19 schools made up of 75 departments, in addition to having 31 courses in 17 graduate schools. The total student population is approximately 28,500.

Noontime Seminar: Bad Investments



Mr. Jarod Baker, Co-Founder of Pacific Economics

On February 20, 2025, Mr, Jarod Baker, who is cofounder of Pacific Economics, visited the college for a Noontime Seminar on tips to avoid bad investment. Mr. Baker has focused on Asia and the Pacific economy since 1998 when he started studying Mandarin Chinese and International Economics. His experience ranges from US federal agencies to leading technology and risk offices in Hawaii. He specializes in market research, competitive intelligence, investment vetting, and international economic development. By conducting in-depth market trend and projection analyses, he and his coworkers enable leaders and the community to make informed decisions with confidence at every stage, advancing their economic and political initiatives at the country level. With a dedicated focus on providing holistic solutions through the integration of economic and political insights, they are able to drive policy development and national strategies that deliver a sustainable impact. With that, they used some hotels in Palau as sample cases for their presentation as bad choices for investments. Mr. Baker then explained the reasons why they are bad investments, how to analyze risks and rewards before investing, as well as the importance of considering these questions before acting.
