### ESTABLISHMENT OF COURSE ALIGNMENT BETWEEN PCC & PHS IN AGRICULTURAL SCIENCE PROGRAM APPROVED

On March 26, 2025 Palau Community College approved the Agricultural Science Course Alignment with Palau High School. The collaborative course alignment working group comprised of members from both PCC and PHS. They are Associate Dean Marianne Temaungil, Associate Dean Ulai T. Ikesiil, Associate Professor of Agriculture Fredrick Ikertang, CRE Researcher Elchung Hideyos, CRE Senior Research Assistant Emngel Singich, PHS Agriculture Academy Program Teachers Dalton Thomas and Iliana Ramarui. The course alignment is designed to facilitate seamless and reliable transition for students from PHS to PCC which enable them to stay on track and potentially complete their degree within the expected timeframe for graduation. The objective of this course alignment is to bridge curriculum gap by identifying and aligning core topics between PHS curriculum and PCC's first year agriculture college-level courses. Moreover, it supports career development that will equip students with relevant knowledge and practical skills to pursue careers in agriculture or advance studies through participation in various school and community projects and finally to strengthen partnerships between the two institutions by fostering collaboration between PHS educators and PCC faculty for a well-rounded and articulated agricultural program. The working group are working on proposed actions including working group tasks, curriculum alignment, dual enrollment opportunities, student engagement initiatives, development of articulation agreement and tracking students to assess effectiveness and student outcome.

## ACADEMIC POLICY 2025

### ETHICAL USE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI) PALAU COMMUNITY COLLEGE

*(Excerpts from AP01-2025)*

On April 9, 2025 Palau Community College Academic Affairs Policy AP01-2025 was approved by the college President as follows:

#### **Puopose:**

- To establish clear guidelines for the ethical use of AI tools in academic and professional contexts.
- Promote transparency, fairness, and accountability in AI interactions.
- Ensure that AI is used to enhance, rather than replace, human thought, performance, and creativity.

#### **Policy Applies to:**

- Students: All undergraduate, graduate, and continuing education students using AI tools for Academic, research, or personal responses.
- Faculty and Staff: All faculty, staff, and researchers using AI tools for teaching, research, administration, or any other institutional role.
- AI Tools: AI technologies include, but are not limited to, tools such as chatbots (e.g., ChatGPT), writing assistants, image generation tools, and AI-driven research assistants.

This policy ensures that the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) is used accordingly, ethically, and responsibly.
