

PCC & FU JEN CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY SIGN MOU

On April 9, 2025 Palau Community College and Fu Jen Catholic University in Taiwan signed a Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) to encourage academic cooperation through research and study.

The purpose of this MOU is to encorage faculty visits from one institution to the other for educational activities and academic research, to facilitate admission of qualified students from one university or college to the other for enrollment of undergraduate and graduate programs including research, to foster the exchange of academic publications and scholarly informations, and to encourage international volunteer service and cultural interaction.

Both institutions acknowledge that the visit by faculty and students from one university/college to the other shall abide by the Republic of Palau and Republic of China, Taiwan entry and visa regulations. In lieu of faculty and students accomodation, both institutions are responsible for all expenses incurred including international and domestic travel, per diem, honoraria and other costs derived. As for Fu Jen Catholic University's volunteer services, cultural and educational interactions and other overseas itinerary arrangements, the university will absorb the costs and planning. PACMED EDCS 640K: Final Presentations on Climate Change

On Monday, April 21, 2025 University of Hawaii at Manoa PACMED students enrolled in EDCS 640K "Interdisciplinary Seminar Leadership Roles in Addressing Climate Change" with instructors Hetine Heine, Kathy Jetnil-Kijiner presented their research findings on climate change at the global level.

Students were assigned to three groups each with different roles. Each role are Climate Scientist, Policy Analyst, Energy Expert, Urban Planner, and Economist. Students were assigned questions related to climate change issues and potential solutions for mitigations and adaptations. Some issues and solutions presented were global warming and how to control the carbon emission, sea level rise and what it takes to prevent influx of water into the shoreline, renewable energy to replace the use of fossil fuel and its dependency, and recycling effort to reduce the use of plastics that have negative impact on the planet.





Privacy and Security: The policy mandated all users of AI tools to respect privacy and confidentiality of individuals including personal information, student records, and academic data. Researcher must also be mindful of data confidentiality and privacy law and protection policies.

Accountability: Students, Faculty, and Staff should be responsible and accountable for their actions when using AI tools in writing, researching, and even summarizing manuscript.




