This award is given to students who have a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.5 and above upon completion of their degree programs.

Outstanding Citizenship Award

This award is given to students who meet the following criteria:

- 1. The student's participation in recreational, social, and student government activities.
- 2. The student's participation in and contribution to community service activities.
- 3. The student's conduct in all phases of campus life.
- 4. The student's contributions to the welfare of fellow students.
- 5. The student's academic record.

Faculty Senate Award

The Faculty Senate Association gives three awards to the top 3 students of the graduating class. The first award of a \$300.00 and a certificate of Academic Excellence goes to the student with the highest cumulative GPA in a degree program. The Second Award of \$200.00 and a certificate of Academic Excellence goes to the student with the second highest cumulative GPA in a degree program. The Third Award of \$100.00 and a certificate of Academic Excellence goes to the student with the third highest cumulative GPA in a degree program.

Adult High School Award

Academic Excellence Award is given to the student who has earned the highest cumulative grade point average (CGPA). The Exemplar Award is given to the student whose behavior on-and-off campus is exemplary, and whose grade point average is 3.5 or above.
