On May 30, 2025, CRE hosted the 2025 Palau Farmers' Focus Workshop. This initiative was made possible through our valued partners at the University of Guam Cooperative Extension & amp; Outreach, who continue to support and empower farmers across the Micronesian region. The Farmers' Focus group at the University of Guam was established to strengthen local farming communities through capacity-building, wellness, and peer-to-peer learning opportunities. The workshop, which brought together more than 50 participants, highlighted the vital connections between health, sustainable agriculture, resilience, and technology in farming communities. Featured guest speakers included Dr. Kuan-Ju Chen, Director of the Agriculture & amp; Life Sciences Division, University of Guam; Don McMoran, Director of the Western Region Agricultural Stress Assistance Program; Dr. Jessie Yi Hsun Wu, Veterinarian Team Lead, National Chung Hsing University; and Gayle Gratop, Assistant Agent in Family, Consumer, and Health Sciences, University of Arizona. ### PALAU SDSU BA COHORT PROGRAM

This course provides an overview of Asian American and Pacific Islander communities, identities, and issues. To place these experiences within a broader historical, structural, and cultural context, the course will begin with an introduction to the history of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the United States, as well as the relevant political events and social forces that have impacted their migration, settlement, and incorporation. We will also examine the diversity of Asian American and Pacific Islander experiences, highlighting racial/ethnic, gender/ sexuality, and class/labor, among others. Further topics of focus may include: migration, discrimination, media, family, education, politics, citizenship, and more. The course will conclude with an examination of the ever-evolving nature of Asian/Pacific Islander America, as well as what lies ahead for the fastest-growing racial demographic in the United States. It is acknowledged that students come with a wide spectrum of knowledge and opinions about
