PCC STUDENTS INTER AT PALAU INTERNATIONAL CORAL REEF CENTER

Daissy and Aleeya from Palau Community College (PCC) had a fantastic internship at the Palau International Coral Reef Center (PICRC)! As part of their Environmental Marine Science course, they dived right into real-world marine research under the guidance of experienced PICRC mentors. They performed reef fish biological sampling—identifying different fish species, counting them, and measuring sizes to help scientists monitor reef health. The interns also helped deploy Baited Remote Underwater Video Systems (BRUVS) around fish aggregating devices (FADs), capturing amazing footage of fish behavior in their natural environment. In the lab, they dissected fish to learn about their anatomy, physiology, and diet. Along the way, they assisted with data collection, analysis, and equipment setup. Every day brought new hands-on challenges and learning opportunities for the interns. By the end of the program, Daissy and Aleeya gained valuable field and lab skills, grown more confident in marine science, and built connections that will inspire their future careers as marine scientists.
