Palau's President, His Excellency Surangel Whipps Jr., welcomed everyone and declared the Games open. He emphasized that the Games were not just about individual achievements, but about the Pacific nations coming together as one community.

During the Summer semester of 2025, two Environmental/Marine Science students from Palau Community College (PCC), Aleeya Uraziri and Daissy Demei, successfully completed their internship at the Palau International Coral Reef Center (PICRC). This internship was part of their program requirement, providing them with handson experience in marine research. Throughout their time at PICRC, Aleeya and Daissy collaborated with the research team on fish sampling and Fish Aggregating Device (FAD) studies. They also utilized Baited Remote Underwater Video Systems (BRUVS) to observe and monitor marine species.
