PACIFIC MINI GAMES CLOSING CEREMONY



Pacific Mini Games Chiarman Dr. Patrick U. Tellei, Team Marshall Island, Team Papua New Guinea and Team Palau

On July 9, 2025, the 12th Pacific Mini Games came to an end with a moving and memorable closing ceremony. His Excellency President Surangel S. Whipps, Jr., together with Senate Floor Leader Kerai Mariur, House Speaker Gibson Kanai, Oceania National Olympic Committee (ONOC) President Baklai Temengil-Chilton, Palau National Olympic Committee (PNOC) President Frank Kyota, and 2025 Pacific Mini Games Organizing Committee Chair Dr. Patrick Tellei, officially bid farewell to over 2,200 athletes and 1,000 coaches, officials, media personnel, volunteers, and supporters who represented 23 proud Pacific nations.

The event celebrated more than just athletic excellence—it honored the spirit of unity and friendship that defines the Pacific region. Over the course of the Games, participants demonstrated not only remarkable talent but also sportsmanship, resilience, and mutual respect. These qualities highlighted that true greatness isn't defined solely by medals, but by the connections built across borders and the shared pride of the Pacific peoples.




