A Brief Overview:

The College of Micronesia Land-Grant is the designated Land-Grant college for the former Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, serving the Republic of Palau, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the FSM states of Yap, Chuuk, Pohnpei, and Kosrae. This program includes collaborations with Palau Community College, the College of the Marshall Islands, and the College of Micronesia-FSM.

COM's Land Grant Program offers

three main areas: Extension, Research, and Residential Instruction. Extension **Programs** enhancing focus community agricultural practices, **Programs** while Research are conducted through Agricultural Stations. Residential Experiment Instruction is integrated into the colleges' regular curricula.

Funding comes from federal sources, including the Hatch and Smith-Lever

Pacific Partnership 2025 Veterinary Team to Collaborate with PCC

As part of the Pacific Partnership initiative, the 2025 veterinary team is tentatively scheduled to host a noontime seminar with Palau Community College (PCC) on September 29, 2025, to promote animal care awareness. A seminar on Animal Care for Domestic Pets as palnned will be held from 12:00 to 12:45 PM at the PCC Assembly Hall, aimed at educating pet owners and welfare animal enthusiasts. Additionally, plans are underway for a tour of the Cooperative Research and Extension (CRE) R&D Station in Ngeremlengui, showcasing the PCC Agriculture Program's piggery and poultry lab/farm. This initiative reflects the Pacific Partnership's dedication to community service and animal welfare education across the Indo-Pacific.

On September 2, 2025, at 9 AM, PCC students, accompanied by instructor, Ms. Yoko Morisaki, visited Payless Market, located just across the PCC Mesekiu Gym. During their visit, they met with General Manager Mr. Peter Gayman for a tour of the store. The students had the unique opportunity to learn about Certified Angus Beef, which is sold at Payless Market. They explored different cuts of meat, learned how each is used in cooking, and practiced reviewing items to assess their Additionally, the students examined ingredients on the shelves and in the produce section that are essential for cooking. Ms. Morisaki explained how to choose the best ingredients when shopping at the grocery store.

Instructor Morisaki teaches the Food Production and Sanitation (TH 101) course, which covers fundamental skills in food preparation, storage, and sanitation. Through this course, students learn to create menus for breakfast, lunch, and dinner, and are trained to serve these dishes to industry standards for quality and health safety. By the end of the course, students aim to gain practical experience, including shadowing and performing the duties of line chefs at prominent establishments such as Palau Royal Resort or Palau Pacific Resort.

On September 4, 2025, a delegation from the Department of Resources and Development of Yap State Government visited Palau Community College (PCC) to discuss potential collaborations aimed at enhancing educational opportunities for Yap students.

The visiting representatives included Ms. Leelkan Southwick, Chief of Workforce Enrichment Division; Ms. Daphne J. Lasudep from the Yap State Scholarship Office; and Ms. Vivian Levarofyang, **Training** Coordinator. During their visit, the representatives engaged in fruitful discussions with PCC's leadership team, which included Hedrick Kual, Dean of Continuing Education; Ulai Ikesiil, Associate Dean of Academic Affairs: Isumechraard Ngirairikl. Director of Financial Aid; and Lisa Rafael, Director of Admissions & Records.

The discussions centered around identifying collaborative opportunities that could greatly benefit Yap students, with a special focus on enhancing vocational programs. The team also explored potential funding avenues, including federal financial aid and scholarships, to ensure comprehensive support for students in achieving their educational and career aspirations.

This visit marks a significant step towards fostering strong ties between PCC and Yap State Government, paving the way for exciting new opportunities for students in the region.
