PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Upward Bound provides fundamental academic support and guidance to participants in their preparation for college entrance. The program provides opportunities for participants to succeed in their precollege performance and ultimately in their higher education pursuits. Upward Bound serves high school students from low-income families and/or high school students from families in which neither parent holds a bachelor's degree. The goal of Upward Bound is to increase the rate at which participants complete secondary education and enroll in and graduate from institutions of postsecondary education.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE UPWARD BOUND PROGRAM?

An individual is eligible to participate in the Upward Bound Program if he/she meets all of the following requirements:

- Is a citizen, permanent resident, or national of the United States; a permanent resident of Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, or the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands; a resident of the Freely Associated States — the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of Palau, or the Republic of the Marshall Islands.
- A potential first-generation college student; or a low-income individual.
- Has a need for academic support and must plan to pursue a college education after high school.
- At the time of initial selection, has completed the eighth grade but has not entered the twelfth grade and is at least 13 years old but not older than 19.
