## Unlocking Potential: PCC Staff Attend Transformative MBTI® Training

In a world where collaboration and communication are paramount to organizational success, the PCC staff recently took a significant step towards harnessing the untapped potential within their team. They participated in a dynamic and eye-opening MBTI® training session that helped explore, know, and understand their own personality and how they can work alongside others, managing differences and playing on each other's strengths.

On December 11, 2025, PCC staff participated in the training facilitated by the Society for Human Resources Management (SHRM). The training featured CITADEL's Director of HR & Corporate Development, Dr. John Rivera. With Dr. Rivera's credentials and certification in MBTI, delivered a session designed explore the science and psychology behind personality traits, offering participants a unique opportunity to better understand how their individual types influence their styles, collaboration leadership tactics, and problem-solving

approaches. Through engaging interactive exercises and real-world workplace scenarios, attendees were encouraged to reflect on their own strengths, blind spots, and stress triggers.

One of the most valuable aspects of the training was the emphasis on decoding personality differences as a means to strengthen teamwork. Rather than viewing differences as obstacles, the staff learned to see them as assets that could be leveraged for improved conflict resolution, enhanced communication, and the development of high-trust teams. This training provided a practical roadmap for transforming these insights into a competitive advantage for PCC.

The feedback and discussions from attendees have been overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing a newfound appreciation for the diverse ways in which team members approach challenges.

Dr. Tellei shared updates regarding our college's endowment fund. To recap, from Mesekiu's News Vol. 27 Issue 1, it announced that the college endowment fund had reached \$8.5 million at the beginning of 2025. By mid-year, PCC achieved its goal of attaining the \$10 million mark, a milestone made possible through the unwavering support of the Republic of Palau government, local businesses, and the wider community. Today, our investment has grown a little bit over \$11 million.

"As we look forward, our next objective is to reach \$30 million," Dr. Tellei stated. "The returns on this investment will be crucial in supporting the college's functions and operations, particularly in times of financial uncertainty or economic downturn. We must continue to provide educational opportunities to our community."

The luncheon concluded with prize raffle drawings and ended with a renewed commitment from all participants to work collaboratively towards these ambitious financial goals, ensuring that Palau Community College remains a pillar of education and support in the community for years to come.


