On January 22, 2026, the Continuing Education Division (CE) at Palau Community College celebrated the achievements of its students with an awarding ceremony for the Introduction to Fabric Design course. This event recognized and honored 11 students who excelled in the three-week program held from January 5 to January 21, meeting every Monday through Thursday from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM, and skillfully guided by instructor Lorraine Tellei.

The course began with participants being introduced to the fundamentals of sewing, including the use of

sewing machines, kits, and a variety of fabrics. Many students, new to the art of sewing, proudly completed their first project by creating handkerchiefs, building a solid foundation for more complex tasks. Building on this experience, students learned to work with zippers, crafting stylish handbags "Tet", which showcased a variety of pocket designs both inside and out.

UB and UBMS Program Hosts Sherry Ngirmeriil to Inform Students About Exciting New Opportunities in Scientific Disciplines



SHERRY NGIRMERIIIL, PROGRAM COORDINATOR FOR THE BACHELOR'S DEGREE AT PCC, IS DELIVERING A PRESENTATION TO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS REGARDING THE NEW BACHELOR OF SCIENCE PROGRAM

On January 16, 2026, the Palau Community College Upward Bound Program held its first student workshop of the year, featuring guest presenter Ms. Sherry Ngirmeriil. Ms. Ngirmeriil is the Program Coordinator for the Bachelor's Degree at the college and is currently working to recruit students for the Bachelor of Science in Science program at PCC.

The Bachelor of Science in Science program builds on the existing STEM curriculum, ensuring a smooth transition from an associate's degree to an undergraduate degree. With this new bachelor's degree offering, students will have the opportunity to undertake in-depth studies into various scientific disciplines, including zoology, botany, chemistry, and more. This program not only prepares students who wish to further their education in STEM fields after graduation but also equips those who intend to enter the workforce immediately with the knowledge needed to contribute to science, research, and other related fields in Palau.

On January 23, 2026, Ms. Ngirmeriil had the opportunity to present at the PCC Upward Bound Math & Science student workshop. She reiterated her encouragement for students to apply to the program once they graduate.

Ms. Ngirmeriil also highlighted notable graduates of the PCC STEM and Environmental Marine Science Programs, many of whom participated in the Upward Bound and Upward Bound Math and Science Programs. One example is Mr. Singe Hideos, who earned his associate degree in Environmental Marine Science before continuing his undergraduate studies at UH-Hilo. He is now pursuing his graduate degree in New York. Students like him were invited to provide feedback on how the new Bachelor's Program at PCC could be tailored to meet the needs of this demanding field, and on how it could be implemented similarly to programs at other four-year universities.

The Government of the Republic of China (Taiwan), through its Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA), is pleased to announce the **2026 MOFA Taiwan Scholarship Program**, offering Palauan students an exciting opportunity to pursue **undergraduate, master's, or doctoral degrees**, as well as **public health-related English-taught programs** in Taiwan. Applications will be accepted from **February 1 to March 15, 2026**, giving students the chance to study at commendable institutions while gaining international experience and cultural exposure.

For the 2026 academic year, **twenty (20) scholarship slots** are reserved exclusively for **qualified Palauan students**, subject to final approval by MOFA. Applicants must complete both the **online application** at <https://taiwanscholarship.mofa.gov.tw/Apply> and a printed hard copy by March 15, 2026. Once completed, both forms and all required supporting documents must be submitted to the **Palau National Scholarship Board (PNSB)**. Recipients are expected to be announced by the Embassy by the **end of June 2026**.
