PCC Mesekiu Derails Kebruka Team Mesekiu Takes PML Lead

In a convincing fashion, PCC Mesekiu wins the final game of the year to take PML lead with 4 wins and 1 loss.

Behind superb pitching by Cleofas "Opas" Iyar, the young Mesekiu team took an early lead in the top of the first inning and never relinquished it, winning the seven inning game with a score of 6 to 3 over Ngardmau Kebruka. In five innings, Opas struck out 9 batters while allowing only 3 hits to earn a win. Alins Kyota pitched the final two innings for the save.

Offensively, Mesekiu was led by Alins who reached base twice and scored both times; Calvin Johanes went 2 for 4 and scored once; and Opas who also went 2 for 4 and scored once.

Refusing to go down, Kebruka's center fielder Brikt singled to reach first base in the bottom of the seventh with 2 outs. Brikt attempted to steal second base, which prompted a throw from catcher Houston Mad that was mishandled by the shortstop and sailed into center-right. While centerfielder Dio and the "golden glove" defense of Stone at home plate proved too much of a combination as they teamed up to thwart Brikt's attempt to spark his team and bring them back in the game. The game ended with the score remaining at 6 to 3 in favor of PCC Mesekiu. *According to Mesekiu players, the win and the first place standing are farewell gifts to CSU bound Stone and Alins. Good luck and enjoy the windy city!*

Mesekiu has two remaining games for the first round, against Peleliu on January 13th and Angaur on January 16th.

PCC Ten Year Master Plan Half Completed

It took the College two years to develop its 10-year Master Plan that went into effect on October 1, 1997. As of September 30, 2002, the first five years were completed. Just previous to that milestone, the Master Plan Committee did a major review of all the aspects that go into long term planning. All planning assumptions, both internal and external, were revisited for any changes that have taken place over the last five years.

In addition, things such as the demographics of the student body, number of students enrolled by program, class size, employment from the Internship Program, etc. were reviewed to up-to-date all information necessary to make decisions for the remaining five years.

Finally, the Accreditation Visiting Team recommendations and the review showed that steady progress is being made in reaching the goals set in 1997. In fact, two goals have been completed ahead of schedule while 47% of the remaining objectives have been completed. With all of this information, adjustments were made and the second five years of the plan written accordingly.

The college now continues to strive in reaching the stated objectives that lead to completing all the goals by September 30, 2007. It must be remembered that this Master Plan is a flexible document that can respond to changes in internal and external conditions at any time. An interim 6-month report is written with a formal annual report disseminated at the end of each year. This allows continual monitoring of progress, challenges and changes that may need to be made to keep the College current in providing the best for the Republic of Palau, its citizens, and neighboring Pacific Islands.
