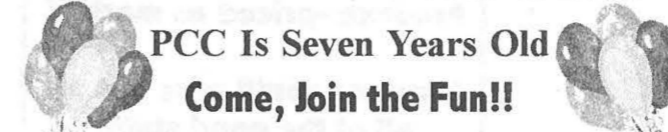

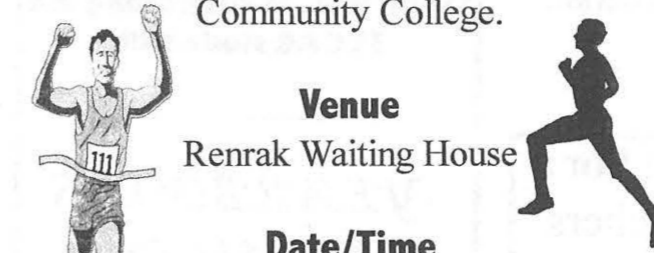

## Dean of Students Visited GCC with Accreditation Evaluation Team

From March 13-16, 2000, the Dean of Students Presley Etibek joined colleagues from Hawaii and California in Guam to conduct an accreditation evaluation visit of Guam Community College (GCC). The purpose of the evaluation visit was to review and validate the GCC's 1999 Self-Study Report to the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges.

This was hard work as all ten (10) GCC evaluation team members worked an average of 12 -15 hours a day. The work of validating institutional self-study reports entails review of planning documents, review of studies and assessment papers, interview of staff, students, board members, and public officials, class visitations, observe functions, operations, and services of the institution, and drafting reports and formulating recommendations by individual team members.

Although it's all hard work and no play, the experience is enlightening and self-enriching. Evaluation team members usually gain more understanding and experience what other institutions are doing differently or similarly with respect to their institutions. This experience is sure to change one's view and attitude toward one's own institution in relation to the self-study process it undergoes every six (6) years.
