## Preparing for High School Visits

In addition to their primary task of sorting out through piles of new student admission and financial aid applications, staff of the Office of Admissions and Financial Aid are also very much engaged in the often unnoticed preparation work for the upcoming high school recruitment visit for school year 2010-2011.

The one week-long recruitment visit slated to commence on Tuesday, January 26 will bring college officials to high schools throughout Palau beginning with Mindszenty High School.

A visit to Palau High School, Palau's biggest high school in terms of population will be on Wednesday, January 27 with over one hundred thirty seniors expected to attend.

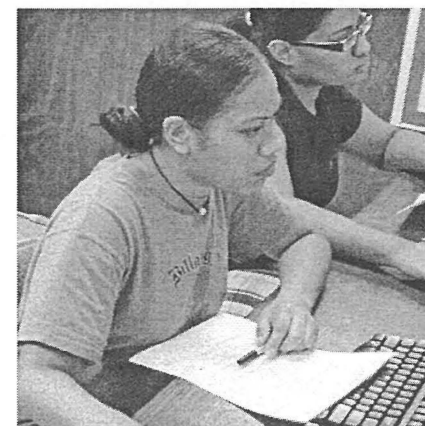
During the week-long visit, recruiters will discuss PCC's academic programs and services including admissions and financial aid requirements. They will also offer assistance to those seniors interested in filling out applications forms. The recruitment effort will also include a briefing for parents on their roles and responsibilities regarding all the available financial aid benefits and for their students.

The college's proactive recruitment approach has proven to work as more and more graduating high school seniors are opting to enroll at PCC for the first two years of their college experience.

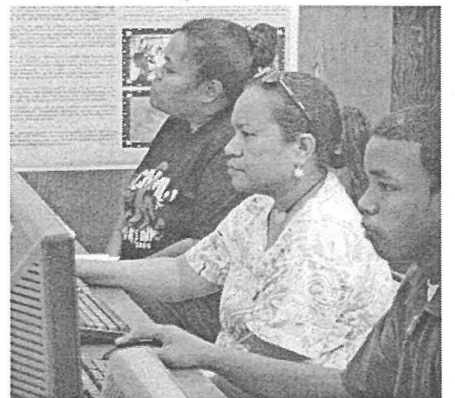

## Online Courses Offered

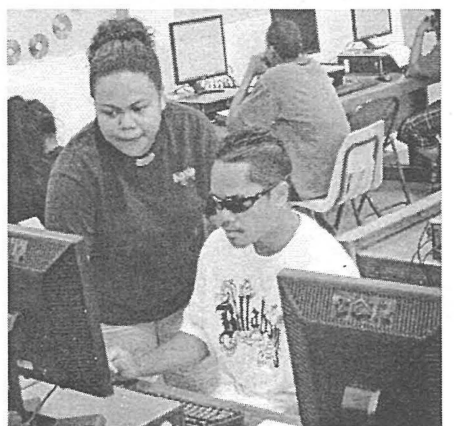
Want to take a PCC course but don't have the time to come to the campus?

You may not be aware of this, but PCC has been offering online courses that you might be able to take. This semester, there are five courses being offered. SC249, EN114, EN112, SS259 and H1259. The courses can be accessed anywhere in Palau if you have an Internet connection and you can even access the courses off island.

If you don't have a computer, you can still take an online course. The college has a computer lab just for this purpose. This online lab has been relocated to the Btaches building, Room 63. So this semester, students will enjoy a roomier lab closer to the center of the campus. The hours of the lab are 9:00 a.m. to Noon and 1:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. daily.
