## PCC Staff and Faculty Appointed by President to Serve on Website Committee

PCC President Patrick Tellei recently appointed twelve College staff and faculty to serve on a committee which will work to develop a website for Palau Community College.

Palau Community College currently has a Local Area Network (LAN) pilot website that it has been working with that can only be accessed on the campus' network. This pilot website was established as a prelude to an actual world wide website so that cliches and problems encountered may be easily addressed (LAN) as opposed to a much more extensive site.

PCC Director of Computer and Data Processing, Bruce Rimirch and PCC System Analyst have been working on the LAN site for about a year now.

The transition from a LAN to a Wide Area Network (WAN) will be the responsibility of the twelve individuals appointed by the President. The twelve individuals will serve on the committee under the direction of Interim Chairman, Bruce Rimirch.

The following is the memorandum from President Tellei appointing the twelve - body committee to create a website for the college:

August 8, 2000

The Palau Community College is creating a committee to work on establishing a web site for PCC. The purpose of the committee is to provide all pertinent information through PCC web page.

As many of you are aware, web sites have become major source of information for colleges and universities throughout the continental U.S.A. and countries in the Pacific. With continued expansion of people's access to computers, a PCC's own web site would be an effective marketing tool to promote the College and its programs.

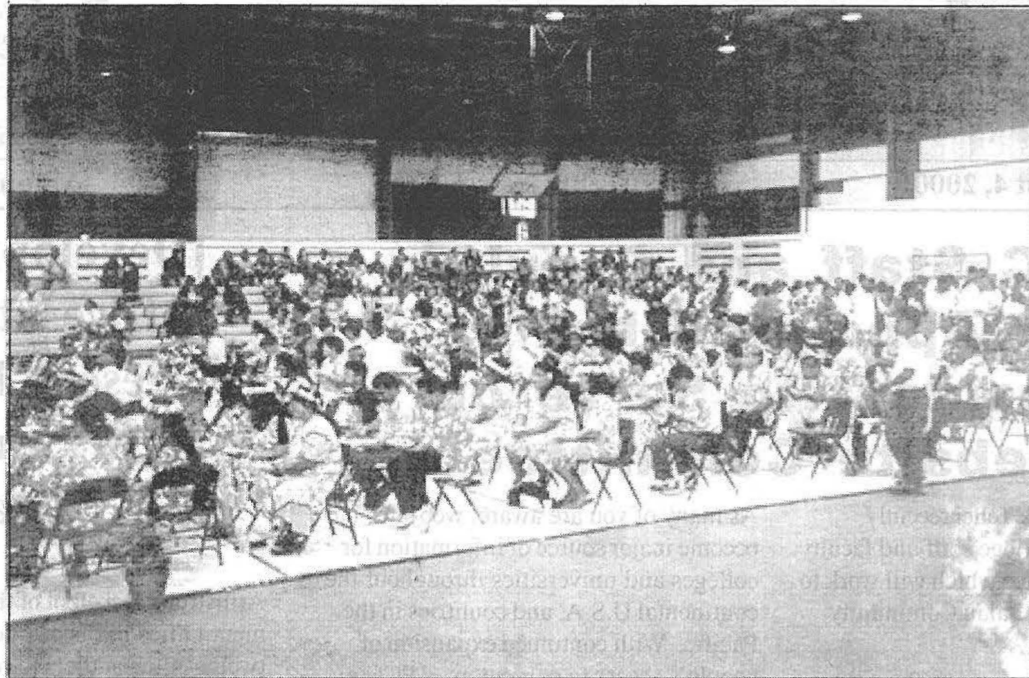
The World Sprints is an outrigger canoe race that is held every two years and attracts outrigger enthusiasts from all over the globe.

Mr. Debelbot is part of a twelve-member team Palau delegation that includes eight women and three men.

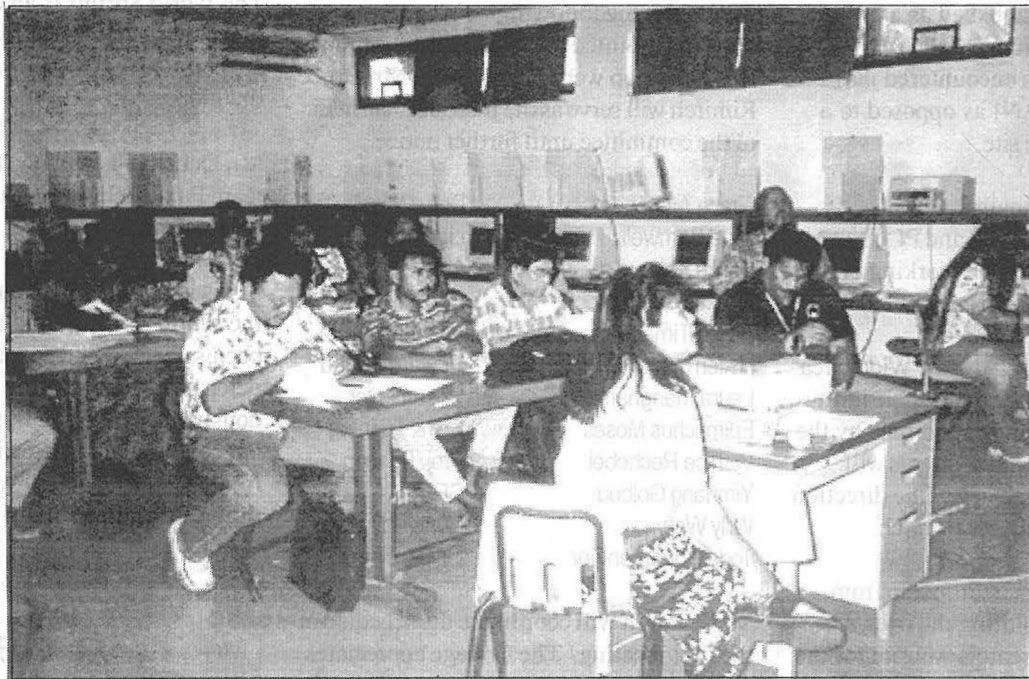

Over 1,000 participants attended the 17th PEC conference. Cultural presentations and dances attracted hundreds of participants to the Palau National Gym every evening during the conference.

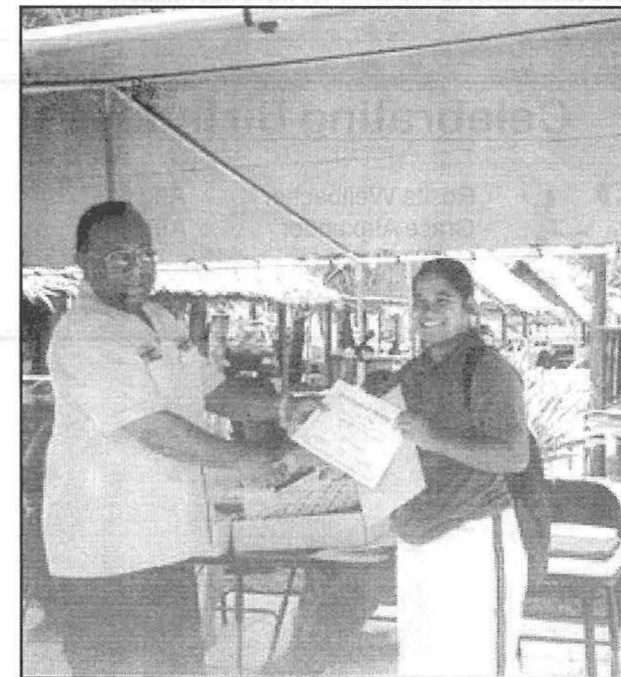

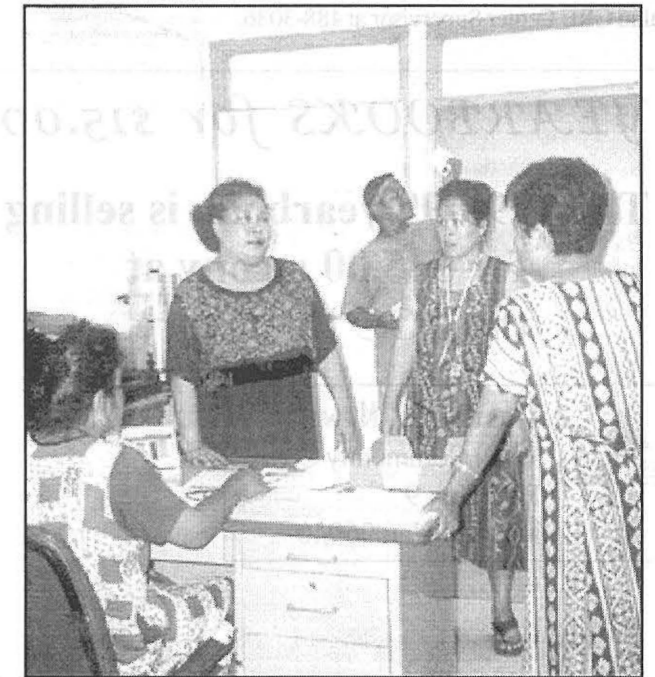
# 17th Annual Pacific Educational Conference
