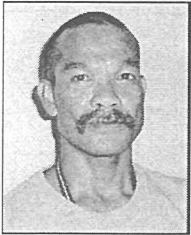


Alumni Notes

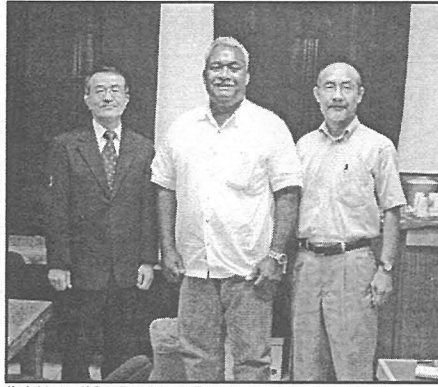
