Education's worth it!

A college education is one of the most durable and worthwhile investment you can make. It's also one of the safest investment possible. When you are clear about what you want, education is usually a way to get it.

Education is a unique purchase. It is one of the few things you can buy that will last you a lifetime. It doesn't rust, corrode, break down, or wear out. Education cannot be stolen, burned, repossessed, or destroyed. Education is a purchase that becomes a permanent part of you. Once you have it, no one can take it away.

Student Survival Tips:

Studying is more than just a way to get grades, it is a way to grow and develop as a person and become a contributing member of society. However, there are several things you must do to become a successful student. Start by taking care of your health, eating properly, exercising, and getting the proper amount of rest. These things will help you to become a better and more effective student.

Good students attend class regularly. They are on time and pay attention to what the instructor has to say. Always let your instructor know ahead of time if you are going to miss a class. Call or email them...they will appreciate it. Make arrangements to get notes from them or a classmate.

Take advantage of extra credit opportunities. This demonstrates you care about your grade and want to do good. Successful students speak in class and participate in class discussions. Remember, there are NO dumb questions as others may have the same questions.

Check with your instructors about grades, clarifying discussion points, and important upcoming dates. Turn in assignments on time and remember to produce a product you are proud of. Don't just do it to get it done.

Be attentive in class. Don't talk, read, sleep, stare out the window, or let your mind drift. Although this is difficult, especially during those boring lectures, but you will be much better off later having been attentive in class.

Complete your work and DON'T LEAVE BLANKS ON TESTS. Guess if you are not sure, go for partial credit. Stay on top of your assignments and know when tests and pertinent dates are during the term.

Seek help when needed. If you need help with a problem set or an assignment, don't dealy and contact your instructor right away. The project beacon also has available tutors that can help.

Have fun learning and trying new things. Your time at PCC is brief so take advantage of the expansive academic offerings. Spend time looking through the course of study and make a "wish list" of all the interesting courses you would like to take.

Develop a positive learning attitude. Though you may have had an "I know everything" attitude in high school, college is an ideal place to remind yourself that there's always room for growth.

Remember, the PCC experience is unlike anything you have experienced before so take advantage of every opportunity available to you. Never be afraid to ask questions. Learning how to prioritize and manage your time well is key to your adjustment and continued success.
